sails steering direct course latitude 23° 00' longitude 85° 00' at sundown took in sail and kept off north north west at eight o'clock left to the wind to the southeast blowing strong at half past two left off with sail to north again had a strong breeze and a heavy sea running all these twenty four hours so ends

Remarks on board Sunday March the 28th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the south east and rapid weather cleared north west to west then the day latitude 23° 51' longitude 86° 44' had a strong breeze thru the night and a heavy sea running so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 29th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north broke out for fair this forenoon latitude 24° 38' longitude 87° 42' at one o'clock left to the wind rapid could the men down from aloft took a moderate gale at sundown began to moderate a little and sea went down a little latter part of the night had it quite moderate and thick foggy so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 30th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north west and rapid weather cleared to the northward this forenoon latitude 24° 17' longitude 88° 04' this afternoon it blew a gale at one o'clock raised a large ship or whale about half a mile from the ship and the boats ready to tow but it gradually rose so fast that we gave them up saw him again in the afternoon kept blowing thru the day headed to the westward thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday March the 31st 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and rapid weather set the jib and mainsail and were round to the southward at ten o'clock made on hazy look in the jib and mainsail and were round to the northward latitude 26° 28' longitude 88° 46' this afternoon could the men down from aloft blow strong thru the day saw a finback at six o'clock took in the foresail headed to the northward thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Friday April the 1st 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze and good weather set the fore reef and were round to the southward at ten o'clock at the jib and mainsail latitude 27° 50' longitude 89° 18' at two o'clock looked ship headed north east by east half east by the wind since south east at six o'clock took in sail headed to the southward thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Saturday April the 2nd 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south east and rapid weather were round to the southward and set the jib catches a porpoise latitude 27° 50' longitude 89° 18' at two o'clock were round to the southward again and it quite moderate the latter part of the afternoon at six o'clock took in the jib headed to the southward thru the night with a fine breeze and good weather so ends this day
