Remarks on board Sunday April the 3rd 1858

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the southeast and pleasant weather at seven o'clock made sail and looked ship to the southeast and distant saw two ships sailing to the eastward by the wind latitude $27^{\circ} 58'$ longitude $88^{\circ} 24'$ ship afternoon breast on strong at two o'clock looked ship catches a Porpoise at six o'clock took in sail wind died away some the fore part of the night at four o'clock the wind shifted round to the northward and blew a gail took in the fore sail and fore top sail so ends

Remarks on board Monday April the 4th 1858

This day commenced with a moderate gail from the northward and a heavy sea running head to the northward and distant three the day at six o'clock the wind much more to the eastward and moderate some latitude $27^{\circ} 36'$ longitude $88^{\circ} 15'$ continued to blow strong through the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday April the 5th 1858

This day commenced with a moderate gail from north east and raged and rainy weather head to the northward and distant about five o'clock then was round to the southeast and eastward and far to the southwest continued to blow strong through the day began strong breeze the night with a heavy sea running so ends

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Remarks on board Wednesday April the 6th 1858

This day commenced with a moderate gail from north east and raged with rain the fore sail broke out for water and had no bottom at two o'clock took in the fore sail made in shenger at six o'clock had down the battery and got it away for the night had it going this the night headed to the southeast all times twenty fathoms so ends

Remarks on board Thursday April the 7th 1858

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the eastward and raged with rain the fore sail and were round to the northward and made the mast head at ten o'clock at the fore top sail latitude $27^{\circ} 45'$ longitude $88^{\circ} 44'$ latter part of the afternoon made in shenger again at six o'clock looked to the southeast and took in the fore top sail for part of the night strong breeze latter part light breeze and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Friday April the 8th 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the southeast and fine weather at all sail and looked ship to the eastward at seven o'clock catches two porpoises latitude $27^{\circ} 45'$ longitude $88^{\circ} 45'$ this afternoon the wind shifted round to the northward at six o'clock took in sail steering south east at ten o'clock the wind headed round to the eastward headed to the southeast through the night with a light breeze and fine weather so ends
