Breeze latter part the wind shifted round south west and round to the eastward so ends

Remarks on board Saturday April the 16th 1859

This day commensal with a strong breeze from south west and a fine weather at the jib and mainmast broke out for water and mill latitude 25.12 longitude 84.41 at two o'clock look in the jib and mainmast at four o'clock made out some light off south east by south at seven o'clock the half watches had thick weather then the night at eleven o'clock left off south east so ends

Remarks on board Sunday April the 17th 1859

This day commensal with a strong breeze from the northward and a fine weather at eleven o'clock at the mainmast and jib and left to the windward made out north east saw a sail to the southward of us steering to the westward latitude 23.30 longitude 82.00 at twelve o'clock looked ship to the westward saw a sail passing to the northward made out to the eastward at three o'clock looked ship again to the eastward had a strong breeze then the night so ends

Remarks on board Monday April the 18th 1859

This day commensal with a strong breeze from north north east and a fine weather saw ten sails steering different courses at twelve o'clock began to moderate since latitude 24.08 longitude 80.20 at four o'clock rose four or five sheets and eleven and set all sail with a light breeze and fine weather made out east at eight o'clock looked ship to the westward at ten o'clock the wind shifted

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Round north east and blow in strong look in the light sails looked several times during the night saw a number of Sails to end

Remarks on board Tuesday April the 19th 1859

This day commensal with a fine breeze from north east and a fine weather saw about twenty Sails heading to the windward at ten o'clock set all sail and started ship to the northward latitude 25.11 longitude 79.40 at four o'clock saw the light house on Cape Florida looked ship heading east south east for part of the night light breeze latter part rain so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday April the 20th 1859

This day commensal with fine weather but calm at eight o'clock took a boat and went on board of the Ship May Blanchard of Yarmouth Main Maine master the was from New Orleans bound to Baracoa saw about thirty sails latitude 26.25 longitude 78.36 at three o'clock got a light breeze from south east square in the yards and started north by east at six o'clock took in sail and left set boats crew watches had fine weather then the night and a light breeze so ends

Remarks on board Thursday April the 21st 1859

This day commensal with a fine breeze from the southward and pleasant weather made sail and left to the wind to the southward and eastward saw several sails broke out for water and from latitude 25.00 longitude 78.19 at six
