Clock took in sail four part of the night light breeze latter part strong breeze so ends this day

Remarks on board Friday April the 22nd 1858

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the southward and rapid way round to the westward nothing going on with remark latitude 28.10 longitude 78.10 at one o'clock were round to the eastward continued to blow strong thru the day at sundown took in the fore top sail and was ship to the westward again at eleven o'clock took in the fore sail and haul down to the westward and made a gail head to the northward

Remarks on board Saturday April the 23rd 1858

This day commenced with a strong gail from north west and a heavy sea running latitude 28.24 longitude 78.17 saw two sails heading to the northward continued to blow strong gail thru the day at sundown began to moderate a little at two o'clock set the fore sail and were round to the westward latter part of the night had it quite moderate so ends

Remarks on board Sunday April the 24th 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northward and pleasant weather set sail and set off south west latitude 28.11 longitude 78.40 saw no sail to the westward of us saw porpoises at half past six o'clock took in sail and

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we round to the eastward had a light breeze thru the day at ten o'clock the wind shifted round to the eastward head to the northward the remainder of the night so ends

Remarks on board Monday April the 25th 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and pleasant weather made sail and backed ship to the southward men employed gutting (dawn latitude 27.40 longitude 78.36 had fine weather all this day at sundown saw breakers on the reef off the bow backed ship to the northward and took in sail head to the northward the four part of the night and the latter part to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday April the 26th 1858

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the southward and east made sail and backed out for water latitude 28.26 longitude 78.36 at one o'clock set off north west had a strong breeze thru the day at sundown took in sail and left to the wind to the northward and eastward had a strong breeze the four part of the night latter part light breeze so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday April the 27th 1858

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the southward made sail and backed ship to the southward and westward broke out for bread and meat and other small stores latitude 28.50 longitude 78.58 at one o'clock set off west at three o'clock the wind shifted round west south west were round and shore
