had it long. The fore part of the
evening at two o'clock left to the wind
head south east with a fine breeze and
good weather so ends this day.

Remarks on board Thursday April the 28th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
the west and good weather with mainmast
and jib men employed sailing down this
forenoon latitude 25° 11' longitude 77° 45'
at one o'clock cut off to the northward
and upland saw nothing at half past
six o'clock took in sail and left
to the wind by the northward and
upland had it earn the fore part of
the night latter part light breeze so ends

Remarks on board Friday April the 29th 1859

This day commenced with strong weather and
earm at ten o'clock cleared off made
sail and left off west by south latitude
25° 24' longitude 77° 50' saw two sails
heading to the southward at sundown
took in sail and left to the wind
to the northward at twelve o'clock the wind
shifted round to the southward wore round
to the westward had a strong breeze the latter
part of the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday April the 30th 1859

This day commenced with a strong
breeze from the westward and a cloudy weather
made sail and backed ship to the southward
at ten o'clock had a squall took in
all sail at twelve o'clock cleared off some
latitude 25° 46' longitude 78° 21' all over

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At o'clock set the foresail and four topsails
and grapples had a strong breeze the remainder
of the day at sundown took in the four
topsails and wore round to the northward
had a heavy squall the fore part of
the night latter part strong breeze
from the northward wore round to
the westward so ends

Remarks on board Sunday May the 1st 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze
from the northward and squally weather
set the four topsails and several sails
headed to the northward and upland
latitude 25° 00' longitude 78° 00' at one
o'clock saw blackfish but did not
lose for there at three o'clock wore
round to the eastward and took in
the four topsails had a heavy squall
at six o'clock cleared off some had
blow strong latter part of the night
had it more moderate at two o'clock wore
round to the westward so ends

Remarks on board Monday May the 2nd 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze
from the northward set the four topsails
krope out for water at six o'clock raised
sprim whails off the weather became three
miles off set the jib and mainmast
and beat to windward after three blocks
on strong at eight o'clock last night
of these at ten o'clock took in the
jib and mainmast blocks on to a
sail latitude 25° 50' longitude 78° 40' this
afternoon lay to heading north west
latter part of the night had it more moderate
so ends
