Remarks on board

Tues day May

the 3rd 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and squally weather was round to the southward and eastward at eight o'clock. Breeze a gale again at nine o'clock. Made the men down from a loft. Latitude $27^{\circ} 45'$ Longitude $78^{\circ} 58'$ at one o'clock were round to the northward & continued to blow strong at this day at six o'clock took in the four topsail. Breeze was then the night and thick rainy with so ends this day.

Remarks on board

Wednesday May

the 4th 1859

This day commenced with a strong gale from east and thick rainy weather at eight o'clock took in the four topsail and continued to blow strong. Made the men down from a loft. Latitude $27^{\circ} 50'$ Longitude $78^{\circ} 55'$ at one o'clock the reef out of the four topsail and sent off south west sent again the four sail and mended it at four sent it up and bent it again at half past four o'clock were round to the northward had a heavy gale took in the four topsail and furl'd it had a strong breeze then the night so ends.

Remarks on board

Thursday May

the 5th 1859

This day commenced with a strong gale from north east and squally weather with a heavy sea running at twelve o'clock got the sun. Latitude $28^{\circ} 35'$ Longitude $78^{\circ} 00'$ headed to the southward and eastward all this day with a heavy gale at sundown were round headed north at one o'clock began to moderate some but blow strong then the night so ends this day.

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Friday May

the 6th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and squally weather at the four topsail and four topsail and were round heading south east by east made the mast heads pass to sails heading to the northward. Latitude $28^{\circ} 55'$ Longitude $78^{\circ} 40'$ at four o'clock were round to the northward again had a strong breeze then the day at sundown took in the four topsail had a strong breeze then the night so ends.

Remarks on board

Saturday May

the 7th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and squally with breeze out for water and provisions at seven were round to the southward and eastward. Latitude $27^{\circ} 50'$ Longitude $78^{\circ} 55'$ at one o'clock let the reef out of the four topsail and sent off south west sent again the four sail and mended it at four sent it up and bent it again at half past four o'clock were round to the northward had a heavy gale took in the four topsail and furl'd it had a strong breeze then the night so ends.

Remarks on board

Sunday May

the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east by east and squally weather at the four topsail and were round to the southward and eastward at nine o'clock commenced raining no latitude at one o'clock sent off were ship to the northward at sundown took in the four topsail had a strong breeze then the night so ends.
