Remarks on board Thursday June the 16th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from south south east and fine weather set all sail nothing going on with remark latitude 31° 30' longitude 61° 25' saw grampscie this afternoon heaved to the eastward threw the day at sundown took in the light sails heaved to the eastward threw the night with a light breeze and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Friday June the 17th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from south east and fine weather set all sail men employed cleaning the anchors and both decks and so forth latitude 31° 52' longitude 59° 43' heaved to the eastward threw the day and saw nothing with remark at sundown took in the light sails had fine weather threw the night and a light breeze so ends

Remarks on board Saturday June the 18th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from south south east and fine weather set all sail men employed setting of the head rigging saw a sail steering to the eastward latitude 32° 13' longitude 58° 57' this afternoon broke out for head and small stores saw grampscie at sundown took in the light sails heaved to the eastward threw the day had it calm most of the night so ends

Remarks on board Sunday June the 19th 1859

This day commenced with fine weather but calm saw grampscie latitude 32° 20' longitude 59° 45' this afternoon got a light breeze from the eastward heaved north east saw two sails one merchant man and one

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Whaler had a light breeze threw the night heaved to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Monday June the 20th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and fine weather saw several sails steering to the northward set all sail latitude 32° 20' longitude 59° 15' saw grampscie heaved to the southward threw the day at eleven o'clock the wing whaler came to the southward broke ship to the eastward so ends these twenty four hours

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 21st 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from south and good weather men employed painting the plank shears and grommets of the hatches and shaping blocks and so forth latitude 31° 52' longitude 57° 44' heaved to the eastward all this day saw a sail to the southward of us reached some ship gaskets had a light breeze threw the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 22nd 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the southward and eastward and fine weather men employed overhauling and shaping blocks latitude 31° 32' longitude 56° 35' saw a sail to the southward of us steering to the eastward saw grampscie had a light breeze threw the night and fine weather heaved to the northward and eastward all these twenty four hours so ends
