at twelve o'clock tacked ship to the eastward had a fresh breeze this afternoon saw a whaling Barge to the westward of us heading to the southward and westward at sundown took in sail and tacked ship to the southward and westward at ten o'clock night the four topsail had it squally threw the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday June the 30th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south south east and fresh with in tacked ship to the eastward nothing going on with remark latitude 32° 00' longitude 46° 00' saw a sail to the northward of us heading to the eastward at four o'clock moderated to a light breeze at sundown tacked ship to the southward and westward and took in sail had a fine breeze thru the night and good weather so ends

Remarks on board Friday July the 1st 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from south east and fine weather set the jib and mainsail at seven o'clock got the ports under way and hoisted out the blackish saw a whaling barge to the northward of us heading to the westward latitude 31° 44' longitude 49° 40' saw a ship steering to the eastward at four o'clock raised anchors ahead set all sail and stood for them but saw nothing more at sundown took in sail had a light breeze thru the night and fine weather headed to the southward all these twenty four hours so ends

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Remarks on board Saturday July the 2nd 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from east south east and fine weather set all sail saw the sails to the westward of us broke out for water latitude 30° 50' longitude 50° 00' headed to the southward thru the day at sundown took in sail had a fresh breeze thru the night headed to the southward all these twenty four hours so ends

Remarks on board Sunday July the 3rd 1859

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from east south east and squally weather made sail saw three sails latitude 29° 42' longitude 50° 00' this afternoon fine weather at six o'clock spoke the Ship Charles J. of New London saw the George & Mary of Weymouth had a fresh breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Monday July the 4th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze thru the night and pleasant weather tacked ship to the northward and eastward nothing going on with remark latitude 29° 05' longitude 48° 00' at two o'clock the Barge George and Mary spoke us and Captain Price came on board and staid until seven o'clock at sundown took in sail headed to the northward the four part of the night latter part to the southward and eastward with a light breeze and fine weather so ends
