Remarks on board Tuesday July the 5th 1859

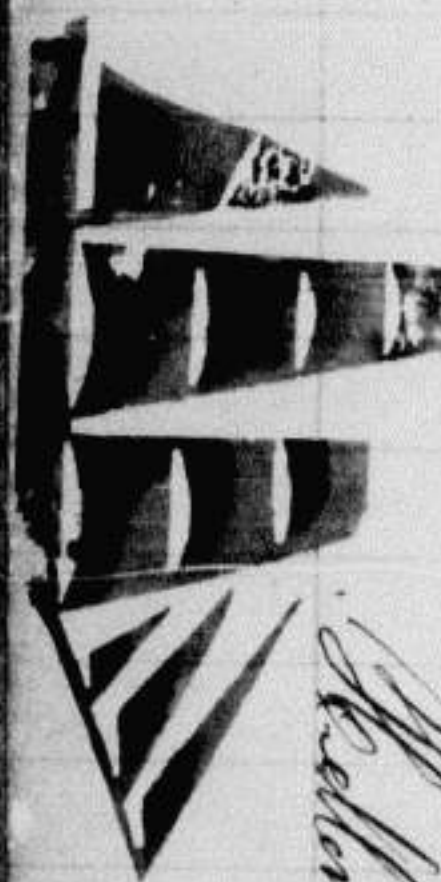
This day commenced with a fine breeze from north east and fine weather set all sail men employed making out for place saw in sail to the northward of us heading to the eastward latitude 29.56 longitude 49.00 nothing going on this afternoon at sundown looked ship to the northward and took in sail had a fine breeze thru the night and good weather made to the northward so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 6th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from east north east and pleasant weather made sail and stood on to the northward men employed over hauling the tackle saw a ship heading to the southward latitude 30.50 longitude 49.09 saw the George & Mary to the westward of us at six o'clock saw breacher had fire off the water her boiler melted off saw her burn then times at sundown took in sail at ten o'clock looked ship to the southward had a fine breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday July the 7th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from south east and fine weather set all sail saw a ship to the westward of us nothing going on with remark latitude 31.55 longitude 49.05 at five o'clock the Barque Helder Haguet of Lisbon captured west spoke us came gammed with us at sundown took in sail at ten o'clock were under to the northward had a light breeze thru the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Friday July the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and fine weather set all sail broke out for water and provisions saw a merchant Barque to the eastward of us latitude 31.56 longitude 49.09 nothing going on with remark at sundown took in sail heading to the northward the fore part of the night better part to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Saturday July the 9th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the east and set all sail and kept off to the northward nothing going on with remark latitude 31.56 longitude 49.22 at six o'clock spoke the Brig Leonaday of Shearwater and gammed with her at sundown took in sail heading to the northward and eastward thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Sunday July the 10th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the southward and fine weather was under to the westward and set all sail saw three sails latitude 31.40 longitude 50.00 heading to the southward washed small can looked ship and took in sail four part of the night fresh breeze better part strong breeze so ends

Remarks on board Monday July the 11th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south south west and raised set the jib and mainsail at seven o'clock took three in again spoke in shape was under to the westward latitude 31.20 longitude 50.30 this afternoon at dusk a moderate sail
