Some falling 31st 46 longitude 49 20 at four o'clock mended some at sundown were round to the westward and set the foresail had a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Monday July the 13th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south west and clear weather with a heavy sea running at eight o'clock set the fore topsail and made the mast heads latitude 32 00 longitude 50 20 continued to clear strong thru the day saw a merchant ship steering to the eastward at sundown took in the fore topsail had a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 14th 1859

This day commenced with a gale from south west and thick weather was round to the eastward men employed getting out buoys latitude 32 00 longitude 50 25 saw a whaling Schooner heading to the westward stood no mast heads this afternoon at sundown were round to the westward had a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 20th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south west and thick smoky weather at the fore topsail and made the mast heads men employed heaving out for water at eleven o'clock were round to the eastward latitude 31 52 longitude 50 32 nothing going on this afternoon with remark at six o'clock saw blackish but did not know it being rapid at sundown took

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At the fore topsail had a strong breeze thru the night heading south south east so ends

Remarks on board Thursday July the 21st 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south west with thick smoky weather set the fore topsail men employed in ordinary ship's duties latitude 31 52 longitude 49 50 this afternoon saw a Barque and a Brig to the eastward of us continued to clear strong thru the day at six o'clock spoke the Barque Sarah of Massachusetts and the Brig Alabama of Siquacan Captain Clark raised up again heading south by east took in the fore topsail had a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Friday July the 22nd 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south west and thick weather men employed heaving out for water at eleven o'clock were round to the eastward latitude 31 52 longitude 49 25 at two o'clock got three heaving out and stood off heaving ship to the northward now men mended the masts at sundown took in and had a strong breeze thru the night heading to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Saturday July the 23rd 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from south west and clear weather with a heavy swell running from north west men and men heaving ship to the northward
