Remarks on board Sunday July the 24th 1859

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from south west and pleasant weather made
sail and stood on to the northward and
westward saw a Merchant ship steering to
the eastward latitude 31.25 longitude 57.10
at four o'clock left off and stood north
east at sundown took in sail and
left to the wind to the westward at
twelve o'clock were ship to the southward and
eastward had a fresh breeze thru the night
so ens

Remarks on board Monday July the 25th 1859

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from south west and clear weather made
sail came tacked ship and steamed north
west saw a sail steering to the eastward
nothing going in with remark latitude 32.00
longitude 57.34 at two o'clock took
in the mainsail and left off before
the wind steered north east saw blackbird
but did not hear at sundown took
in sail and left to the wind heading
south east at twelve o'clock were round
to the westward had a fresh breeze thru
the night so ens

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 26th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze
from south east and clear weather but
saw many sail came out of north

Nothing going in with remark saw a Merchant
Ship steering to the eastward latitude 33.00 longitude
57.24 at one o'clock took in the mainsail
and were round and stood west north east
saw blackbird going quick to the wind
at five o'clock left to the wind to the
westward and kept the fore topsail saw
a Merchant Brig steering to the eastward
at sundown took in the fore topsail had
a strong breeze thru the night and squally
weather so ens

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 27th 1859

This day commenced with a moderate gail
from south west and squally weather at
seven o'clock made the gun down from
mast at ten o'clock were round to the
southward and eastward latitude 33.24 longitude
57.24 saw a large Ship steering to
the eastward commencing to blow all this
day at twelve o'clock began to moderate
and clear off so ens

Remarks on board Thursday July the 28th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze
from south west and clear weather made
sail and tacked ship to the westward
broke out for water at eleven o'clock
ruined part of a ships long boat here
away the paint boat and went to her
and calked a new of fish latitude 33.00
longitude 57.55 at one o'clock left
off before the wind to the northward
saw nothing at sundown took in sail
and left to the wind to the westward
had a fair breeze thru the night and
good weather so ens
