Remarks on board Friday July the 29th 1859

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from the southward and fine weather made sail and tacked ship to the eastward nothing going on with remark latitude 33° 00' longitude 50° 22' saw grasshoppers this afternoon at sundown took in sail had a light breeze through the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Saturday July the 30th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from south east and fine weather set all sail and tacked ship to the southward and westward saw a Schooner heading to the eastward men employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 33° 04' longitude 50° 22' at one o'clock tacked ship to the eastward had a light breeze through the day at sundown took in sail had it calm through the night so ends

Remarks on board Sunday July the 31st 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and fine weather set all sail and stood to the southward and eastward saw a number of grasshoppers latitude 33° 16' longitude 49° 50' saw a sail to the westward of us heading to the northward had a light breeze through the night at sundown took in sail and left off south at twelve o'clock left to the westward south east the remainder of the night fine weather so ends

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Remarks on board Monday August the 1st 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from east north east and good weather made sail and stood on to the southward and eastward men employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 32° 39' longitude 49° 00' at one o'clock left off south had fine weather through the day at sundown took in sail and tacked to the westward heading south east at twelve o'clock were round to the northward had a fine breeze through the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 2nd 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from south east and fine weather set all sail and tacked ship to the southward men employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 31° 55' longitude 48° 50' at two o'clock saw a blackfish and board all three boats but could not get near them so gave them up and came on board again at five o'clock came again but had the same luck saw a sail off the weather bow at sundown took in sail at twelve o'clock one ship to the northward had fine weather through the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 3rd 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from north east and fine weather made sail and tacked ship to the southward and eastward at half past ten o'clock raised buoys off the sea beam five miles off left off for them but saw nothing more of them at twelve o'clock left to the
