longitude 48.00 one o'clock lay away
again and the waist boat shook
the wheel and got a blow and so
the bark and boat took the line and
the crew picked up the waist boat
and the bark and were at the
the look him along side at sundown
look in sail had fine weather than
the night the bark and bark
boat got stone but not had the waist
boat lost three oars and part of a
but head to the northeast than the
night scenes

breeze from the east and good
weather got the sailing gear all set and
commenced sailing latitude 31.50 at
sundown no idea of sailing yet the
body in one junk set by watches

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
the east and good weather bore up the
east and sailed it got there at eleven
o'clock and run down the sailing gear
haist for the four years and stone
in to the northeast and distance had
fine weather than the night scenes

Remarks on board Sunday August the 7th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
the east and fine weather saw a ship to
the east and as sailing to the east
all hands employed on the ship ran
two cases of oil below latitude 32.29 at
sundown took in the jib and fine light
had it square at eleven o'clock had the
cock down had a heavy shower of rain
at two o'clock started the work again so
soon

Remarks on board Monday August the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
north east and squally weather saw several
sail heads to the east latitude 33.20
longitude 51.22 run some oil below at
four o'clock sailed up at eleven o'clock
got under way and sailed down had fine
weather than the night scenes
