Longitude 45° 38' saw green fish this after
noon at sundown took in sail had
it come threw the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 17th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze
from the western and fine weather made
sail and steamed east the water employed
towing down saw three sails heading to
the southward and eastward latitude 28° 50'
Longitude 44° 36' saw grasshoppers and
squirrels at sundown took in sail and
left to the wind to the northward at
twelve o'clock were round to the southward
had a light breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday August the 18th 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
north west and fine weather made sail and
tacked ship to the northward the water
employed towing down latitude 34° 36' longitude
44° 19' this afternoon the wind hauled round
north and breeze on ship saw a sail
to the westward of us heading to the
southward at sundown took out sail
up the fore top sail heading to the
eastward latter part of the night the wind
hauled round north east were ship to the northward
so ends

Remarks on board Friday August the 19th 1857

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from north east and a fog but clear
within made sail and steamed on to
the northward saw a barque steering south
east saw grasshoppers nothing going
on with remark latitude 35° 25' longitude
43° 32' saw a ship steering west north

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Left at four o'clock tacked ship heading
south east at sundown took in sail had
the fore top sail had a strong breeze thru
the night so ends

Remarks on board Saturday August the 20th 1857

This day commenced with a moderate
gale from north east and thick
weather saw latitude and longitude at three
o'clock the wind hauled round east and
began to moderate wore ship heading
north east broke out for water had
a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Sunday August the 21st 1857

This day commenced with a fresh breeze
from the western and pleasant weather
made sail and steamed on to the northward
latitude 35° 46' longitude 42° 30' saw grass
hoppers at sundown tacked ship to the
southward and eastward and took in sail
at one o'clock were round to the northward
had a light breeze thru the night so
ends

Remarks on board Monday August the 22nd 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze
from the eastern set all sail the water
employed making out for small boats
latitude 36° 15' longitude 41° 45' in clock
tacked ship heading south west at
four o'clock spoke the Schooner
S. M. S. of Providence and gave
with her she had just got thru strong
can a thirty barrel shell it saw down
took in sail had a fine breeze thru
the night and fine weather so ends
