Remarks on board August 1st the 13th 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze from north east and fine weather set all sail (and) tacked ship to the northward the watch employed working in the evening at ten o'clock tacked ship again to the eastward latter 36-21 longitude 42-20 at three o'clock saw sheets off the weather became eight miles off tacked ship for them but did not get near enough to turn to tell what they were at sundown tacked ship and took in sail had a strong breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 24th 1857

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from the eastward set the jib and mainsail and tacked to the northward the watch employed during the main tacked stay saw grampses latter 36-34 longitude 42-43 saw three sails at four o'clock tacked ship to the southward and eastward at sundown took in sail the wind died away to a light breeze latter part had it calm so ends

Remarks on board Thursday August the 26th 1857

This day commenced with fine weather but calm at seven o'clock sailed blackfish and found the two harbor boats but could not get on in five three found came on board at nine o'clock got a light breeze from north east set all sail and stood to the southward and eastward broke cal for breeze and water latter 36-20 longitude 42-54 saw grampses one a sail heading to the eastward at sundown took in sail had it calm the fore part of the night latter part got a light breeze so ends

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Remarks on board Friday August the 26th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northward and fine weather set all sail saw blackfish but did not hear of ten o'clock tacked ship to the westward latter 36-15 longitude 42-20 at two o'clock tacked ship again to the eastward nothing going in with remark at sundown took in the light sails had it calm thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Saturday August the 27th 1857

This day commenced with fine weather but calm broke out for much sea grampses no larks and longshore condors came thru the day at sundown took in sail continued calm thru the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Sunday August the 28th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from south west and fine weather set all sail once steamed to the eastward saw a sail to the southward of us steering to the eastward latter 36-24 longitude 42-44 saw grampses at sundown took in sail had a light breeze thru the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Monday August the 29th 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the southward and westward made sail and steamed to the eastward and near the main top-sail and lowered it and set it up again latter 36-45 longitude 42-20
