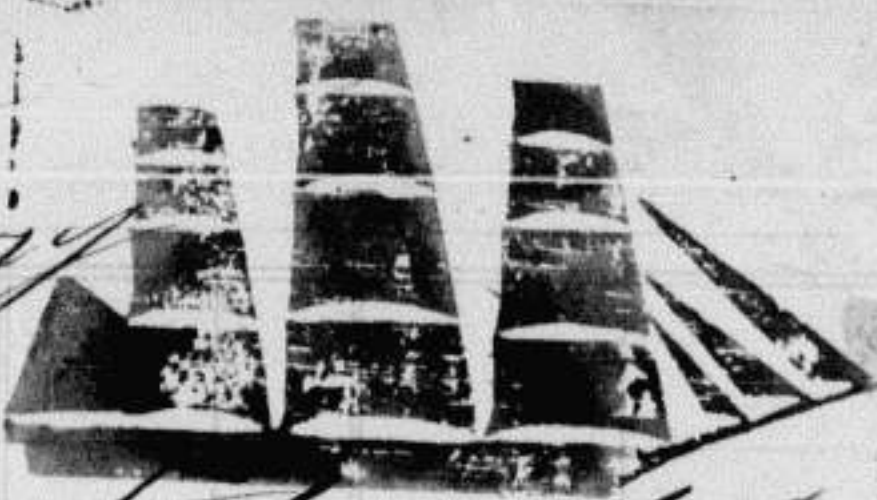


Brig State Corv



Latitude 38° 10' Longitude 82° 00' at four o'clock began to moderate saw two sails one bearing to the southward and the other showing to the eastward had it quite moderate through the night so ends

Remarks on board Monday September the 5th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the westward and squally weather set the first point and commenced steering down latitude 37° 52' Longitude 82° 52' at four o'clock got three strong down one breeze off the ship had it calm through the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday September the 6th 1859

This day commenced with fine weather but soon more employed in necessary ship duties latitude 37° 44' Longitude 82° 00' at two o'clock got a light breeze from south west steam east south east saw no persons at sundown took in sail had a fresh breeze through the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday September the 6th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the westward and squally weather under sail one steam east saw two ships steering east north east under all sail latitude 38° 00' longitude 84° 27' at five o'clock raised a small sperm whaler when left to the wind one hour and the two lumber boats and whaler then until dark but could not get near him in water spot two men three line one go down it was come on board and took in sail and kept off east again had a strong breeze through the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday September the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the westward and squally weather broke out for breeze and flower latitude 39° 11' longitude 84° 50' at three o'clock the wind hauls round north east ship heading east south east by the wind at four o'clock saw breaches off the weather beam seven miles off at sundown took in the first point at twelve o'clock the wind hauls round to the eastward one ship to the northward had a strong breeze through the night and some rain so ends

Remarks on board Friday September the 9th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the eastward and thick rainy weather at twelve o'clock tilted up some main sail and stood on to the northward and eastward at one o'clock raised and the stars of floors at five o'clock took ship to the northward saw a ship heading to the northward upon all sail at sundown took in sail had it calm the four point of the night better part cleared off and the wind hauls round to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Saturday September the 10th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the westward made sail and steamed in for the harbor broke out for water at two o'clock got round off sandy beach and the captain went on shore day off and on until sundown when the captain came on board set half watches in a show off shore had it rainy through the night clear off and on so ends
