Remarks on board Friday September the 23rd 1859

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from the westward and clear weather made sail and set for water and provisions. Lat. 34° 35' long. 121° 10'. This afternoon set off south east at three o'clock raised a breeze of the weather from eight miles off but for it at five came up with it. proved to be grampus at some distance in the forenoon wither looked back latter part of the night blow in strong so ends

Remarks on board Saturday September the 24th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the northward and rainy weather set the forenoon and set off south at ten o'clock did not rain and clear off some latitude 34° 06' long. 121° 50' saw grampus at three o'clock got a light breeze from north but had a heavy swell running from the northward at sundown took in sail, clear off wither looked better had a light breeze from the night and fine weather headed to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Sunday September the 25th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from south west and clear weather made sail and steared south south east then a heavy swell running from the northward saw grampus at latitude 33° 25' long. 121° 24' this afternoon had a strong breeze at sundown fine did not rain some fresh in sail had a light breeze from the night and fine weather so ends

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Remarks on board Monday September the 26th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the westward and fine weather set sail and stood on to the southward and got under the water employed breaking out for water and provisions. Lat. 32° 45' long. 121° 49' steared south east by south all this day at sundown took in sail had a calm then the night so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday September the 27th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from south west and fine weather made sail and stood on to the southward turned up the wind to the eastward and pointed it saw a sail to the southward of us heading to the southward latitude 32° 20' long. 121° 49' nothing going on wither remark this afternoon at six o'clock took a boat and went along side of the ship Lougher of New Bedford and got some papers she was 24 months out with four hundred barrels had it calm then the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday September the 28th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from east north east and fine weather broke out for water and provisions saw three sails to the westward one was merchant man latitude 32° 15' long. 121° 57' this afternoon had a fresh breeze and squally weather at sundown took in sail had a fresh breeze from the night and light squally of rain steared south east all this day so ends
