Remarks on board Wednesday October the 5th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and raged wither till the jib and mainsail were split off the masts, down the land saw several small crafts some up along the land at sundown took in sail and left the wind to the eastward off the east side of Port Antonio saw three whalers to the south of us going off shore the four part of the night latter part in shore had a strong breeze through the night so ends cruising off Port Antonio

Remarks on board Thursday October the 6th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and raged wither till about the mid to the weather nothing going on worth remark at twelve o'clock left the wind to the eastward and set the jib saw three whalers at sundown took in the jib had a strong breeze through the night so ends cruising off Port Antonio

Remarks on board Friday October the 7th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and raged wither at ten o'clock saw blackfish but did not hear saw three whalers to the south off as at one o'clock set the jib and mainsail had it more moderate saw a great many porpoises at sundown took in sail had a light breeze through the night so ends cruising off Port Antonio

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Remarks on board Saturday October the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and fine wither set all sail at ten o'clock saw the two harbor boats for blackfish but did not get any at seven came on board saw three whalers to the southward off as all blackfishing at sundown took in sail had a light breeze through the night so ends cruising off Port Antonio

Remarks on board Sunday October the 9th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and fine wither set all sail saw grasshopper saw one whaler and several small fishing vessels at sundown took in sail had a light breeze through the night so ends cruising off Port Antonio

Remarks on board Monday October the 10th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northward set all sail watch employment making out for water at ten o'clock saw a hawk with her boats down board way our boats were pale up to them they had got fast to the spin whails and the rest of the stroke three started off eyes out chased them at three o'clock the harbor boat struck a small sail and came on board with it the harbor and wait boats started them until five o'clock and gave them up got on board at seven o'clock got a breeze from the northward took in sail one half of shore had a light breeze through
