Remarks on board Tuesday October the 11th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
north west and fine weather set all sail.
about 10 o'clock missing up the blubber saw
the horizon to the southward of us sailing in
saw four other whalers saw grampian haw
fin, wither blow, the day at sunrise
look in sail the wind hauled round to
be captured had fine weather three the
night is over of the south west
point off Port Antonio

Remarks on board Wednesday October the 12th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze
from south east and fine weather set
all sail and left off south west saw
one whaler to the windward sailing going
in with remaining blubber 27.50 lengthen
14.00 on the grand Canaries ahead of
us saw a ship heading to the southward
under all sail at 10 o'clock the
wind hauled round south west at
sundown look in sail had a light
breeze the four part of the night latter
part had it calm so enas of grand
Canaries

Remarks on board Thursday October the 13th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze
from south west and fine weather set
all sail started the work and boiler
out the wharf at ten o'clock Captain
Smith came on board from the bark
Selen of Wharfedale and the mate went
on board of her heading to the westward

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Threw the day at six o'clock rather
smoke and in fore at sundown took
in sail had it going the four part
of the night latter part of the night
clear of scenes of the grand Canaries

Remarks on board Friday October the 14th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze
from the northward and fine weather under
sail and took a ship and stood in for
the land at nine o'clock the Brig
Leopold of Edinburgh spoke as it
bore south raised steam whaler ahead
four miles off ahead was the boat with
pala to make the loaded boat shook a
small on age the net but the windward
eyes at about three o'clock and give them
up came on board and sat in the wharf
at four o'clock the Schoona Water miss
spoke us and Captain Small came on
board and explained with open the solar
at sundown got the wharf clear away
stood off shore to the eastward had
a light breeze the night is over
off the north point of grand Canaries

Remarks on board Saturday October the 15th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze
from the eastward and fine weather set
all sail saw two whalers the watch
missing up the wharf at sundown
look in sail had it calm three the
night Soenas off the grand Canaries

Remarks on board Sunday October the 16th 1859
