 at seven o'clock got their beating and came
 down harbor came thru the city at sundown
 saw Rock of Linnap ahead of us had
 a light breeze thru the night came to
 the western Sooner

Remarks on board Monday October the 17th 1857

This day commenced with a light
 breeze from westward set sail and
 sailed for Anna Bay watch employed in
 many shops duties from the day
 had a calm at two o'clock got a
 breeze from north north west station
 in for Santa Cruz at sundown took
 in sail being was about fifteen miles
 off had a light breeze thru the night
 Sooner

Remarks on board Tuesday October the 18th 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
 north west and fine weather set sail and sailed
 in for the land at one o'clock came to
 anchor at Santa Cruz being ready to
 away the city and looked back to get
 water at sundown reached off with fine
 fine weather thru the night Sooner lying
 at Santa Cruz

Remarks on board Wednesday October the 19th 1857

This day commenced with fine weather
 went in shore with the east and later
 the water at seven o'clock got the water
 off wind blow in strong from north
 east this afternoon the starboard watch
 went in shore harbor watch employed

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Getting off wood and storing down water at
 saw down the harbor watch came in harbor
 had fine weather thru the night so
 ends lying at Santa Cruz

Remarks on board Thursday October the 20th 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
 north east and fine weather at eight o'clock
 the harbor watch went in shore watch
 on board employed got off wood and storing
 at one o'clock the watch came
 on board got off the vessels at sundown
 got ready for sea had it calm so the
 we could not get under way had it calm
 thru the night Sooner lying at Santa
 Cruz

Remarks on board Friday October the 21st 1857

This day commenced with a fresh breeze from
 north east at seven o'clock took the anchor
 and stood to sea to the eastward saw one
 whaling Schooner sailing to the southward
 at one o'clock were ship and steam to the
 southward and westward at sundown took
 in sail and sailed to the southward to the southward
 and entered latter part of the night
 had it more in reach so was off
 the south point of Anna Bay

Remarks on board Saturday October the 22nd 1857

This day commenced with a fine breeze
 from the north and fine weather
 made sail and left off the southward
 at twelve o'clock the Anna Bay came
 to length west at four o'clock the Schooner
 La Chama spoke as I went to bed and
 gave us as she was in sight and
 clear at sundown took in sail
