

Brig *Heath Cory*

At ten o'clock left up north by east latitude 44° 20' longitude 19° 21' watch employed making out for small steers saw blackfish but did not hear nor pinkies had a strong breeze thru the day latter part of the night the wind died away to a light breeze So ends

Remarks on board Saturday November the 5th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward set the gill and mainsail the watch employed in ordinary ship duties latitude 42° 25' longitude 18° 42' at three o'clock the wind backed back to north east strong south thru the day at sundown took in sail had a light breeze thru the night So ends strong south all of these twenty four hours

Remarks on board Sunday November the 6th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northward and fine weather saw grampies latitude 41° 45' longitude 18° 36' had a light breeze thru the day fine part of the night had it calm latter part got a light breeze from the northward again So ends steamed south by west all these twenty four hours

Remarks on board Monday November the 7th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northward and good weather watch employed making out for water saw several schools of porpoises latitude 41° 00' longitude 18° 22' at one o'clock left up north by east by south had a light breeze thru the day and night steamed south west So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday November the 8th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and good weather the watch employed in ordinary ship duties latitude 40° 36' longitude 18° 44' at one o'clock left up north by east grampies at sundown took in sail and left to the wind shifted east south east had a light breeze and good weather thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday November the 9th 1857



This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and fine weather made sail at seven o'clock raised blackfish and board away all three boats and got two fish thru on board and caught up the black one latitude and longitude at one o'clock hoisted the boats again but could not get fish at sundown took in sail had it calm thru the fine part of the night latter part had a heavy thunder squall So ends



Remarks on board Thursday November the 10th 1857



This day commenced with a light breeze from south east and sunny weather at eleven o'clock lowered off some of the latitude and longitude at four o'clock hoisted for blackfish and all three boats ahead took them along side but one taking him in a beam away the other two and got the catches over board had it calm the fine part of the night latter part got a light breeze from north west ship heaved to the northward and eastward So ends



Remarks on board Friday November the 11th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and good weather set all sail
