Remarks on board Thursday November 17th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from north east and good weather the watch employees breaking out life water and provisions since a Barque to the northward of us standing to the eastward rather 9.00 lengthen out at two o'clock sea way came at six o'clock got a light breeze from the westward rather part of the night had a big thunder squall the wind should veer north east and blow strong so every ship heading to the eastward. all these twenty four hours

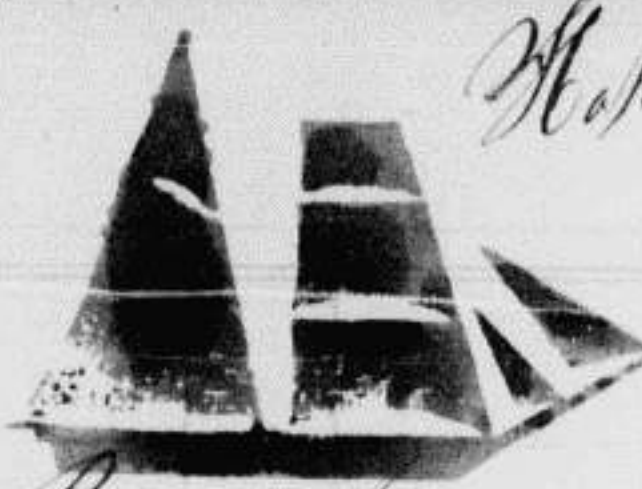
Remains on board Flying November the 18th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and rising within a short period east south east at five which abated off and died away again. Between four & five the watch comprised in rain and sharp squalls - a squall to the westward of us making to the eastward at five which got a light breeze from the westward but fell rather than the night so was

Remarks on home Saturday November the 19th 1859

This day I went with a light bear from the westward side of the lake at seven o'clock since have been twenty miles off the shore of Delos the watch employed in making the duty have a light bear there for night but the cables are got the anchor off of the shore at sundown the line bore east by south distance eight miles off shore & will be to the eastward of us at eight o'clock came to anchor off the north side of Delos there had fine weather thru the night & a breeze

Remarks on board Sunday November the 20th 1855

This day commenced with a light breeze from the northeast and from within got snow early and stood in to the Harbor at noon. vessels came to anchor at Delos then was five other whalers lying near the Barge Halls and Brig together with the Russell being on Piacance and John Adams part of the crew went on shore to have a look around and sundown came on board again had fire within three the night so ended lying at Delos

Remotes on board Kangy Nornhai's the 21st of 1848

This day commenced with ~~the~~ fine weather got a raft of oak off and stowed it close this fine noon the Barge with the got underway and went out this afternoon got off an other raft of oak and cut a boat load of wood and got it off at sundown nothing off work had fine weather thru the night So ends lying at Delos

Remits on hand Tuesday November the 22nd 1857

This day commenced with fine weather at seven o'clock went on shore and cut two boats load of wood and got off one washed off the ship and painted the hinges on the lathern side this four noon this afternoon went on shore and cut another boat load of wood but could not get it off it being engaged at sundown washed off one had fine weather thru the night Seenas being at Delas

Remarks in house Wednesday November the 23rd 1818

This day commenced with rain & then at
