Eight o'clock ahead off gal of three boats
head off and being in the shelter side of the
ship at six o'clock an English ship of the
name of *Chas. Lee* at anchor at sundown
needed off with her five masts then the night
Seenas being at Dales

Remarks on board Thursday November the 24th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from
the south and good weather at seven o'clock
took the anchor and went to sea in company
with four other whalers the Brig *Hepton* and
Schooner *Roswell King* and *Reiniger* and
John Adams left the *Barge Leona* was
going at anchor had five masts then the day
at sundown Dales being east distance ten miles
saw the whales astern of us ship headed north
west by the wind at six o'clock backed ship to
the southward and distance with the boat of the night had
it equally Seenas

Remarks on board Friday November the 25th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze from the
south and good weather during the two quota
boats and pursued them no further and long time
had light breezes from the day from all
points of the compass saw to sail to the north
of us had five masts then the night ship
headed south west by the wind Seenas

Remarks on board Saturday November the 26th 1857

This day commenced with fine breezes from
the north and good weather and the small
heads the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty
between 5-28 longitude 15-04 at four o'clock
died away from at seven o'clock gal a light

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Breeze from the westward ship headed north west
and by the wind Seenas

Remarks on board Sunday November the 27th 1857

This day commenced with a light breeze and
sunny weather at eight o'clock ahead off had
the wind from the southward then at eight o'clock
headed west by north latitude 5-42 longitude
15-46 saw a *Barge* to the northward
of us standing to the westward at six
o'clock set back and water took in the light
sails had it rain then the night Seenas

Remarks on board Monday November the 28th 1857

This day commenced with light breezes from the north
and good weather made sail and stood in to the
westward catch a fisher the watch employed in ordinary
ship's duty between 5-25 longitude 15-58 at three
o'clock the ship's room to south west ship headed
north west at sundown took in the light
sails had a light breeze then the night Seenas

Remarks on board Tuesday November the 29th 1857

This day commenced with fine breezes from north
east and good weather at the light sails
nothing and then ordinary ship's duty going on
between 5-28 longitude 16-39 at one o'clock the wind
headed round to the eastward took in the fore and
aft sails had a fresh breeze ahead north west
by west all the day saw nothing had a fine
breeze then the night and good weather Seenas
