Night Sees

Remarks on board Wednesday December the 7th 1859

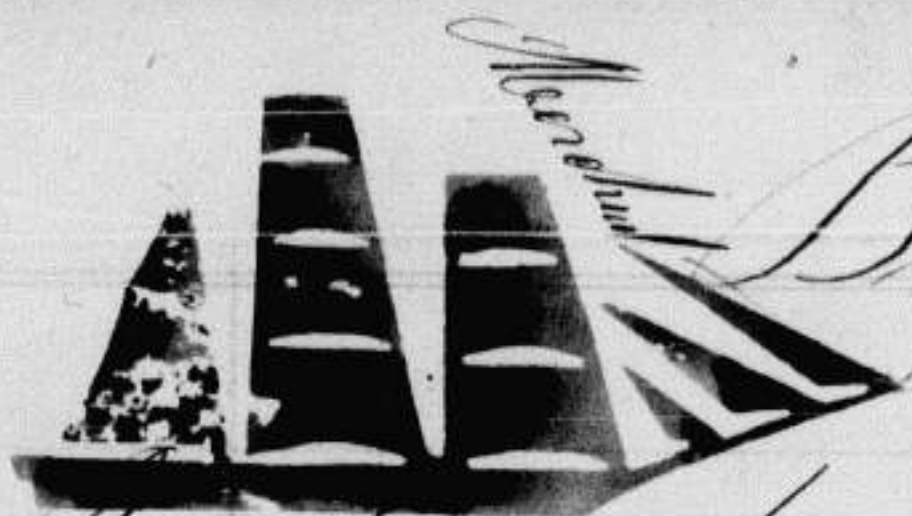
This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and south east and squally with more suit and speed on to the northward and then whaling to the westward of us bearing to the northward some blackfish but did not have much of the day but it was very strong breeze and rain we killed one longfin and a porbeagle. Brigs standing to the southward at sundown took in their white sails north by the wind was strong breeze then the night and raged with Sees

Remarks on board Thursday December the 8th 1859

This day commenced with strong breezes from the southward and then raged with more ship heads south east by south we killed one longfin and two whales to the westward of us gave a steam ship standing north north west then strong then the day the watch employed in ordinary ship duties had a strong breeze then the night so ends

Remarks on board Friday December the 9th 1859

This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and strong with more rain to the northward at eleven o'clock ahead off our side some three whales killed one longfin 21-25 at sundown took in sail at half past six o'clock spoke the Brig Pennaman two months sail ahead from a boat and went along side of her to get some papers had a light breeze then the night Sees

Remarks on board Saturday December

the 10th 1859

This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and strong with the eight off our side water employed looking out at nine o'clock spoke the Brig San of Baltimore some three other whales and two Merchant vessels killed one 25 longfin 24-25 one blackfish but did not take at any o'clock left to the wind to the northward had a strong breeze at sundown we rounded to the southward and eastward had a fresh breeze then the night Sees

Remarks on board Sunday December

the 11th 1859

This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and squally and raged with the watch ship to the northward and more suit killed one longfin 21-24 latter part of the afternoon the wind was away to a light breeze at sundown took in sail and it was then the night Sees

Remarks on board Monday December the 12th 1859

This day commenced with light breezes from the eastward and fine with the eight off our side the four sails the watch employed mending it saw a sail to the northward and westward of us killed one longfin 21-24 this afternoon had it calm at sundown took in sail at the part of the night got a light breeze from north east ship headed south east by east Sees

Remarks on board Tuesday December the 13th 1859

This day commenced with light breezes
