 to the northward latitude 64° 25' longitude 21° 55'
 the watch employed working in the rigging
 saw a Merchant ship steering south west
 and sandan took in sail had a light breeze
 the night So ends

Remarks on board Thursday December the 14th 1857

This day commenced with light breezes from
 the eastward set all sail on three abakers to
 the westward of us latitude 64° 25' longitude 21° 52'
 the watch employed making out at four
 o'clock were away from at sandan took
 in sail had it calm then the night So
 ends

Remarks on board Thursday December the 15th 1857

This day commenced with light breezes from
 south west snow sail and clear to the northward
 the watch employed working out latitude 64° 25'
 longitude 21° 45' at three o'clock spoke the
 Brigai Revere of New Bedford thirty
 seven days out Captain T. J. Pratt in
 home to get some papers of sandan
 took in sail saw three other whalers
 had it calm then the night So ends

Remarks on board Friday December the 16th 1857

This day commenced with light breezes
 from north east and smoky wither snow
 sail and clear to the northward the
 watch employed in ordinary ships duty
 at ten o'clock clear off latitude 64° 48'
 longitude saw five whalers saw grampus
 at four o'clock were away from at sunset
 took in sail had it calm then the night
 So ends

Remarks on board Saturday December the 17th 1857

This day commenced with rain and squalls
 wither ship heading to the northward at
 ten o'clock lighted at some snow sail
 and took on to the northward we better
 not longitude middle of the day had
 it calm at four o'clock got a light
 breeze from the southward ship heading to
 the eastward at sandan took in sail
 a heavy sea came along side of us
 from the Brig Peruvian of Providence
 had got nothing in the ground but the
 part of the night the wind made scarce
 to the eastward and blew strong ship
 heading to the northward So ends

Remarks on board Sunday December the 18th 1857

This day commenced with fresh breezes from
 the eastward and good wither and clear
 to the northward and eastward and made
 sail gave a Merchant vessel steering to the
 southward under all sail latitude 64° 34' longitude
 21° 50' saw two whalers the afternoon
 at sandan took in sail had a light
 breeze at four o'clock were ship to the
 southward had light breezes then the
 night So ends

Remarks on board Monday December the 19th 1857

This day commenced with fine breezes from
 the eastward and good wither set all sail
 the watch employed in ordinary ships duty
 saw a Schooner steering to the westward
 latitude 70° 13' longitude 21° 26' saw blackfish
 but did not see for the at sandan took in
 sail ship heading south east by south
