at ten o'clock sail away from at
sundown look in sail had it clear
than the night. So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday December the 21st 1854

This day commenced with light breeze from
the northward and fine weather made sail
and stood to the westward the watch employed
going out water and mending the mainmast
length 21.46 length 21.29 in the night
to the northward of us saw grasshopper
at sundown look in sail at night
one ship to the eastward had light breeze
than the night. So ends

Remarks on board Thursday December the 22nd 1854

This day commenced with light breeze
from the northward more ship and made
sail and stood to the westward the
watch employed in ordinary ships duty saw
a schooner blacked by length 21.56 length
21.58 had light breeze than the day
at sundown look in sail had it equally
than the night. So ends

north east and thick smoky rather more
mist and stood to the northward and
westward the watch employed in ordinary
ships duty. Length 22.41
at ten o'clock look in sail to the eastward
saw grasshopper at sundown look in sail
at one o'clock one ship to the westward had
light breeze than the night. So ends

Remarks on board Saturday December the 24th 1854

This day commenced with fine breeze from
the northward and good weather set all
sail at seven o'clock look in sail to the
westward the watch employed in ordinary
ships duty. Length 22.36
saw a sailing Schooner standing to the
westward at sundown look in sail ship
huddling east by the wind at night
o'clock one ship to the northward had
fine breeze than the night. So ends

Remarks on board Sunday December the 25th 1854

This day commenced with fresh breeze
from north east and pleasant weather
set all sail and stood on to the
northward saw three merchant ships
sharing with us and under all sail
length 22.16 at two
o'clock look in sail to the eastward saw
one whaler to the westward of us at
sundown look in sail ship huddling east
by the wind at one o'clock one ship to the
northward had fine breeze than
the night. So ends
