Remarks on board Sunday January the 1st 1860

This day commenced with light breezes from the northward and good rather more sail and one round and steered out our grompers' ballow to 80 longitude 20. 06 saw eight merchant vessels and one ship at sundown took in sail and left for the sand baria north and had light breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Monday January the 2nd 1860

This day commenced with light breezes from north east and fine rather more sail and good up to the northward the watch employed heaving out for water at ten o'clock hoisted all three boats for black fish but did not get any at twelve o'clock came on board ballow to 12 longitude 20. 06 saw one merchant vessel steering to the southward under all sail had fine weather thru the day at sundown took in sail and left for the sand baria north and had light breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 3rd 1860

This day commenced with fine breezes from north east and good rather more sail and steering distant across the watch employed nothing clear the main topmast rigging ballow to 18 longitude 20. 18 at five o'clock sighted the Schooner Thruier of Boston Captain Small and gamed with her had seen nothing before of the Schooner John Adams getting a Whirl a few days previous at sundown took

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the sail and were ship to the southward latter part of the night had it very So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 4th 1860

This day commenced with light breezes from north east and very rather a more gale blowing up a little at ten o'clock hoisted the Leeward and West boats for blackfish and got one to the Leeward boat came on to the bar in same on board and hoisted in the fore latter part of the forenoon blew strong at four o'clock held up raining and moderated some saw a Brig to the forward of us at sundown took in the fore sail and left heading to the northward latter part of the night had it very So ends

Remarks on board Thursday January the 5th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes from east north east and very rather at eight o'clock at the foremast had it more moderate and lightest up some at the fore and mainmast are better no longitude at ten o'clock took a ship to the southward and started the rocks and hoisted out the blackfish got three at four o'clock saw a Merchant brig steering to the southward saw a Whaler to the forward of us at sundown took in sail and left heading south east had fresh breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Friday January the 6th 1860

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north east and thick smoky rather more sail and took a ship to the northward the watch employed in ordinary the day saw
