Remarks on board Saturday January the 7th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and pleasant weather made sail and left off to the westward the watch employed keeping out at night o'clock spoke the Barque Maria Lewis of Edgington had upon nothing in the ground at seven o'clock spoke the Barque Amazon of Southampton fifty days out bore a head and went along side of her to get some papers left off north west again latitude 6³² longitude 22³⁵ saw three Merchant ships steering to the westward under all sail saw blackfish but did not hear for there at sundown took in sail and left to the wind to the westward better part of the night were round to the westward had fresh breeze then the night. So ends

Remarks on Sunday January the 8th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from north east and raged with set the jib and mainsail saw two Whalers to the westward latitude 6²⁸ longitude 22³⁸ saw a Merchant ship staying south under all sail at four o'clock spoke a ship to the westward saw blackfish but did not hear at sundown took in sail had strong breeze then the night. So ends

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Remarks on board Monday January the 9th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from north east and raged with the watch employed in ordinary ships duty latitude 7⁰⁰ longitude 22⁰⁰ at one o'clock saw ship and steamed south saw blackfish but did not hear for there at sundown left to the wind steamed south east had strong breeze then the night. So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 10th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from north east and raged with the watch employed making out for bread and other stuff latitude 6²⁰ longitude 22⁵⁷ at two o'clock saw ship to the westward had strong breeze then the day and night. So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 11th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from north east and raged with left off to the westward the watch employed in ordinary ships duty latitude 6³⁵ longitude 22⁰¹ at one o'clock were round and steamed south saw blackfish but did not hear for there at three o'clock raised a breeze off the water low five miles off left to the wind and steamed for it but saw nothing more had strong breeze then the night. So ends

Remarks on board Thursday January the 12th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes from north east and raged with the watch employed in ordinary ships duty to the westward and set the jib and mainsail the watch employed in ordinary ships duty
