Remarks on board Monday January the 13th 1860

This day commenced with high breeze from north east and fresh with the sun set and kept off by the outward at nine o'clock spoke the Schooner "Pioneer" of Peruvian had seen nothing further to 35 longitude 22 20 saw two Merchant Ships steering to the southward under all sail at 10 the western ship the ship at sundown took in sail and kept to the southward the northern ship part of the night breeze up strong with rain with

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 14th 1860

This day commenced with strong breeze from north east and fresh with rain at night which held up running at twelve o'clock blew in to a gale latitude 6 56 longitude 23 38 close up the foremast and furl it blew strong all of this day ship lying to heading to the northward continued to blow strong then the night

Remarks on board Sunday January the 15th 1860

This day commenced with a gale from north east and fresh with rain ship to the southward at twelve o'clock began to moderate some falling to 20 longitude 24 22 at four o'clock got the foremast and masted the mast heads ship heading south south east had strong breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Monday January the 16th 1860

This day commenced with strong breeze from north east and fresh with the sun set and kept off by the outward at nine o'clock spoke the Schooner "Pioneer" of Peruvian had seen nothing further to 35 longitude 23 17 ship heading south east by east then the day had fresh breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 17th 1860

This day commenced with fine breeze from north east and good with the sun set and shed in to the southward and eastward the watch employed in ordinary ship duty latitude 6 41 longitude 24 50 had fine weather then the day saw nothing of sundown took in sail at one o'clock one ship to the northward had light breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 18th 1860

This day commenced with light breeze from north east and good with the sun set again the foremast and commenced running it latitude 6 20 longitude 24 24 at four o'clock got the foremast and bent it again long and better than the day of sundown took in sail ship heading north east by the wind at one o'clock one ship to the southward had light breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Thursday January the 19th 1860

This day commenced with light breeze from north east and with smoky with at all sail and one ship to the northward the watch employed in ordinary ship duty latitude full longitude 24 43 had a light breeze then the day at sundown
