 mast head and at ten o'clock
 at the mainmast latitude 14, 30 longitude
 45, 58 had fine weather then the day
 had a fresh breeze then the night good
 weather steady north west all
 of these twenty four hours So ends

Remarks in board Friday February the 3rd 1860

This day commenced with fresh breeze
 from north east and good weather the
 watch employed in ordinary ship duty
 latitude 15, 00 longitude 48, 19 saw five
 hawks eight off west by north had fresh
 breeze then the day at one o'clock took
 in the mainmast had fresh breeze from
 the night strong west by north So ends

Remarks in board Saturday February the 4th 1860

This day commenced with strong breeze from
 the eastward and raged with the watch
 employed looking out for water and provisions
 latitude 15, 07 longitude 50, 50 had strong
 breeze then the day had strong breeze
 then the night So ends Sunday
 west by north

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Remarks in board Sunday February the 5th 1860



This day commenced with strong breeze
 from the eastward and raged with the
 ship sailing west under all sail saw
 five hawks latitude 16, longitude 52, 13
 caught a hawk had strong breeze
 then the day eight off west had fresh
 breeze then the night So ends

Remarks in board Monday February the 6th 1860

This day commenced with strong breeze
 from north east and raged with the
 at eight o'clock saw a hawk then
 the night west of at eight off for
 it had saw nothing more so eight
 off on the coast again latitude 15, 07
 longitude 55, 50 had light squalls
 of rain this afternoon at sundown
 eight the fourteenth sailing west by
 north had strong breeze then the night
 and raged with So ends

Remarks in board Tuesday February the 7th 1860

This day commenced with strong breeze
 from north east and raged with the
 hauled the reef out of the foremast
 the watch employed cleaning deck foremast
 the iron work saw five hawks latitude
 15, 19 longitude 50, 26 saw two seals
 sailing to the westward at sundown
 eight the fourteenth sailing west
 by north had strong breeze then
 the night So ends
