Between 11th and 12th no breeze continued to blow a gail than the day and a heavy sea running at sundown had a severe moderate gale seven o'clock at half water had it moderate. Strong the night took several times during the night. So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday February the 15th 1860

This day commenced with fine breeze from north east and good when much sail was set off for St. Thomas at ten o'clock got off the harbor but at and at eleven o'clock came to anchor at St. Thomas West Indies. Just the sails there is what party sail of vessels lying here of different nations. Their officers all here, employed cleaning ship in side and put out painted the figures at five o'clock got the vessel cleared and hooked off with for the night. Had fine weather than the night. So ends lying at St. Thomas West Indies.

Remarks on board Thursday February the 16th 1860

This day commenced with fine weather the harbor watch went in shore the liberty

The watch in board employed setting up rigging the foremast the afternoon commenced "bunching" ship at five o'clock part of the harbor watch came in board at sundown hooked off with had fine weather than the night. So ends lying at St. Thomas West Indies.

Remarks on board Friday February the 17th 1860

This day commenced with fine weather the harbor watch got ready and went in shore the harbor watch employed working on the rigging and painting ship several vessels came in during the day and several went out had fine weather than the day at five o'clock hooked off with had fine weather than the night. So ends lying at St. Thomas West Indies.

Remarks on board Saturday February the 18th 1860

This day commenced with fine weather the remainder of the harbor watch came in board excepting the Cook and the harbor watch went in shore the watch in board employed painting ship several vessels left port and several came in had fine weather than the day at sundown got there painting excepting the harbor watch hooked off with at eight o'clock the harbor watch came in board had fine weather than the night. So ends lying at St. Thomas West Indies.
