Monday February the 20th 1860

This day commenced with fine weather washed
clouds and broke out by water raised some
clouds at 11 in then some vessels came in
and some left port at five o'clock took
the boat out of the port and brought him
on board got all ready for sea had fine weather
thru the night So ends going to St Thomas

Remarks on board Tuesday February the 21st 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from
the eastward took the anchor and stood to sea
to the northward got the anchor on the bow
and then one under at twelve o'clock off the
port point of Santa Cruz saw several vessels
lying at anchor in the harbor no bottom and
at 10 o'clock this afternoon had it equally and
a great ship heading south with sail by the
wind at seven o'clock anchored sail for the
night at boats were water had strong
breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday February the 22nd 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from
the eastward and aged rather nothing going
on more than ordinary ships Duple bottom
boat long 44 ft 6 in had it some mackerel
this afternoon at the jib and mainsail had
fresh breezes thru the night shore with
by 10 o'clock So ends

Remarks on board Thursday February the 23rd 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes
from the eastward and aged rather
the water embayed in various places

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Duple left off south by port bottom 32 ft
long 44 ft 6 in had strong breezes thru
the day at seven o'clock took in sail
and half by the wind headed south
east at twelve o'clock one ship to the
northward had strong breezes thru the night
So ends

Remarks on board Friday February the 24th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes
from the eastward and aged rather the
water embayed breaking out for provisions
were round and a great south with sail
bottom 32 ft 6 in long 44 ft 6 in saw
hampacks at sundown left to the
wind headed south east had it more
moderate thru part of the night
one round to the northward had fresh
breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Saturday February the 25th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes
from the eastward and good rather
were round to the southward and made
sail broke out for water saw plenty
of hampacks bottom 32 ft 6 in long 44 ft 6 in
at five o'clock raised the anchor
of Benguilla off the port bow then a
fifteen miles off at sundown took in
sail at seven o'clock took ship to the
northward atched a packet had fresh breezes
thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Sunday February the 26th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes
from the eastward and good rather
the mainsail saw hampacks and fresh
