Off day for sea when the captain got their fire
in shore had fire with them the night
So was lying at St. Thomas

Remarks on board Saturday March the 10th 1860

This day commensurate with fine breeze from
the eastward and good weather at nine o'clock
got under way and stood to sea stand
south west then fine weather then the day
at sundown took in sail and left off west
south west. Let Boat, Long watch off Cook
island had fine weather then the night So
was this day

Remarks on board Sunday March the 11th 1860

This day commensurate with fine breeze from
the eastward and strong weather turned the reef
out of the foresail and left off west
at ten o'clock stand off saw humpbacks
no ballen and so forth saw a Schooner
standing to the southward at sundown took
in sail and left to the wind to the southward
off Cape Boas latter part of the night was
around to the northward but fine weather then the
night So was

Remarks on board Monday March the 12th 1860

This day commensurate with light breeze from
the eastward and good weather turned the reef
out of the topsail sent down the foresail and
commensurate evening in saw a brig standing west
stand several different courses during the day
sailing off Cape Boas had fine weather then
the day at sundown took off
west and took in sail ship heading north by
east - latter part of the night saw around
to the southward fine weather So was

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 13th 1860

This day commensurate with fine breeze from
the eastward and good weather made sail
and left off to the westward went to
work on the foresail again at nine o'clock
got it finished and bent it saw humpbacks
no ballen and so forth saw several sails
standing to the northward then the schooner passed
at four o'clock left to the wind to the
southward at sundown took a ship to the
northward and eastward and took in sail
headed to the northward the fore part of
the night latter part to the southward So was
Cruising in the schooner passage

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 14th 1860

This day commensurate with light breeze from
south east and good weather made sail
and hoisted up for water saw two sails
standing to the northward no ballen and
so forth saw humpbacks had light breeze
then the day at sundown took in sail
ship heading to the northward had fine
weather then the night and light breeze
So was Cruising in the schooner passage

Remarks on board Thursday March the 15th 1860

This day commensurate with light breeze
from the eastward and good weather made
sail and left off south west saw humpbacks
ballen 18500, length 67m 56 at two o'clock
saw the island of St. Thomas and a boat
to go in where but found it hard
Raged to land so came on board again
left off west by south at sundown took
in sail had fine weather then the night
So was
