Remarks on board Friday March the 16th 1860

This day commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and good weather turned the reef out of the topsail the watch employed repairing the Mainmast east of west latitude 17.45 longitude 69.29 had fine breezes from the ~~East~~ day at sundown neared off peak and took in sail had fine weather then the night steered west by north So ends

Remarks on board Saturday March the 17th 1860

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the eastward and good weather turned the reef out of the topsail saw St Domingo to the northward the watch employed repairing the mainmast no bottom and no bottom saw humpbacks at four o'clock got the mainmast repaired and bent it at sundown took in sail and huffed to the wind to the southward off Cape Bely later part of the night breezes in strong were ship to the northward So ends

Remarks on board Sunday March the 18th 1860

This day commenced with strong breezes from the eastward and good weather sailed off to the westward saw a Steam Ship steaming to the westward no bottom and no bottom saw four Whales lying at anchor in under the lee of the land got four ashore left the land to the northward got off the cables and bent them at four o'clock saw the masts at San Diego near Long and saw home a boat and the Captain along with the Bark Charles and the Bark George

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Deer and the schooner William H. Hill of Providence and the Brig Excel of Long had seen which sailed long in the last month the ground the island to the point of the night had it moderate So ends

Remarks on board Monday March the 19th 1860

This day commenced with light breezes from the northward and good weather took the Anchor and stood out to the southward and neared broke out for water and bottom saw humpbacks at twelve o'clock the wind huffed some to the southward at two o'clock saw the Bark Lady Suffolk heads which and half a humpback saw four other sailing vessels at sundown took in sail and headed off shore to the southward later part of the night were ship and stood in shore had light breezes So ends Crossing off San Diego

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 20th 1860

This day commenced with fine breezes from the southward and good weather made sail saw grampoid the watch employed in evening ship started saw four Whales had fine weather threw the day at sundown took in sail and headed off shore to the southward later part of the night were round and headed in shore had light breezes then the night So ends Crossing off San Diego

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 21st 1860

This day commenced with light breezes from south east and good weather made sail and stood on in shore nothing going
