saw two other harks and a Brig at
sundown took in sail headed off shore
then the night had it rainy So ends Cruising
off San Diego

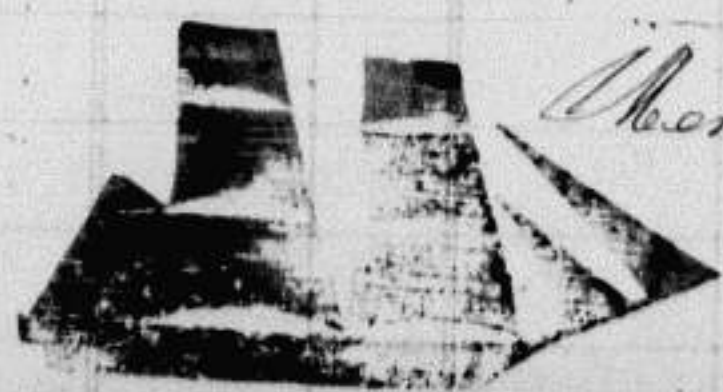
Remarks on board Friday March the 23rd 1860

the westward and good weather made sail
the watch employed in ordinary ship duty
saw grampies had fire water then the
day saw four Whalers at sundown took
in sail spoke the Charles & Edwards and
gained with her had light air then
the night So ends Cruising off
San Diego

Remarks on board Saturday March the 24th 1860

This day commencing with light air from
the southward and good weather made
sail broke out for water and flour
at eleven o'clock bound to harbor and
wreck boats for Blackfish but did
not get any but light air then
the day saw three other Whalers at sundown
took in sail and headed off shore
later part of the night had it calm
So ends Cruising off San Diego

Remarks on board Sunday March the 25th 1860

This day commencing with fine weather and
light air from the southward set all sail
and worked off shore saw one whale and
Merchant ship had light air then the
day at sundown took in the light sails
had it calm then the night So ends
this day off San Diego

Remarks on board Monday March the 26th 1860

This day commencing with light air from
the southward and fine weather set all
sail the watch at work in the evening at
ten o'clock side away came again two
whales and one Merchant ship at two o'clock
got a fresh breeze from the eastward hauled
up the yards and stood to the northward
at sundown took in sail and stowed ship
off shore to the southward later part of
the night blew in strong So ends off
San Diego
