Got a breeze stand north north west then
the night So ends

Remarks on board Friday April the 13th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from north
east and good weather set all sail at
eight o'clock, raised land off the sea and
with her latitude 22° 22' longitude 74° 22'
at one o'clock drove away, came off leeward
stand land a boat and took the vessel
to keep off of the keel at three o'clock
got a breeze from the northward, took
up the boat at five o'clock, about seven
came on board from a *Boat* Schooner
reported the sailing business to be bad
at sundown look in light sails stand north
by east until twelve o'clock then light to the
wind heads north half east had fresh
breeze then the night So ends off
Stocking Island

Remarks on board Saturday April the 14th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from the
eastward and good weather set all sail the
watch employed getting out water at twelve
o'clock saw the Run by off the sea began
latitude 23° 40' longitude 74° 35' at three
o'clock saw *Walden* Island off the weather beam
had fine breeze then the day saw a sail
standing to the weatherward at sundown took
in the light sails and set *Boats*
Crew watches had light breeze then
the night stand north by the
wind So ends

Remarks on board Sunday April the 15th 1860

Commenced with light breeze from
the eastward and fine weather set all
sail saw *grampian* latitude 24° 46'
longitude 74° 50' at four o'clock kept
off north north west had fine breeze
at sundown took in the light sails
had fine breeze then the night standing
north north west So ends

Remarks on board Monday April the 16th 1860

Commenced with fresh breeze from
the eastward and good weather set the
middle staysail turned up the *Whist*
boat and painted it up the *Boat*
J. H. Derr of Providence standing
north north west saw three Merchant
ships standing to the weatherward latitude
26° 45' longitude 75° 54' this afternoon
turned up the Sturked boat and painted
it the watch employed working on the
sailing off north west by north
at sundown shortened sail for the
night stand north west by north then
the night So ends J. H. Derr

Remarks on board Tuesday April the 17th 1860

Commenced with fresh breeze from the
eastward and good weather made sail
and kept off west the watch employed
striking blocks and raising gear davis
jumbo latitude 28° 04' longitude 75° 05' broke
out for water and bread left at work
west and set the jib had fresh breeze
thru the day at sundown took in
sail and were round and left the
