Remarks on board Wednesday April the 18th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the eastward and good weather set the jib and mainsail the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty at ten o'clock were ship and stand north west latitude $27^{\circ} 42'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 30'$ had strong breezes then the day at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed north east by the wind then the night S. ends

Remarks on board Thursday April the 19th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the eastward packed ship to the southward and set the jib the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty saw the sails steering to the northward latitude $28^{\circ} 15'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 22'$ had fresh breezes then the day at sundown took in ship and took in the jib headed north east by the wind then the night S. ends

Remarks on board Friday April the 20th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and good weather made sail and were ship ~~stand~~ south west heading going on with remaining latitude $28^{\circ} 00'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 40'$ stand south west then the day at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed north north east had light breezes then the night S. ends

Remarks on board Saturday April the 21st 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the southward and good weather made sail at six o'clock hoisted a boat and picked up a cask and a barrel saw Blackfish and hoisted a boat for them but could not get in to them latitude $27^{\circ} 45'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 55'$ broke out for help and water from it came the middle of the day at five o'clock got a light breeze from the southward at sundown took in sail and left off north at ten o'clock left to the wind to the eastward had light breezes then the night S. ends

Remarks on board Sunday April the 22nd 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from south west and good weather made sail and stood on to the southward at eleven o'clock saw the keel ahead packed ship to the northward latitude $29^{\circ} 22'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 30'$ had fine breezes then the day and good weather at sundown took in sail headed north west at twelve o'clock were ship to the southward had fine weather then the night S. ends

Remarks on board Monday April the 23rd 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and fair weather made sail and stood on to the southward at six o'clock saw the Reef packed ship to the northward and ordered the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude $27^{\circ} 45'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 57'$ saw two sails steering to the northward and one steering
