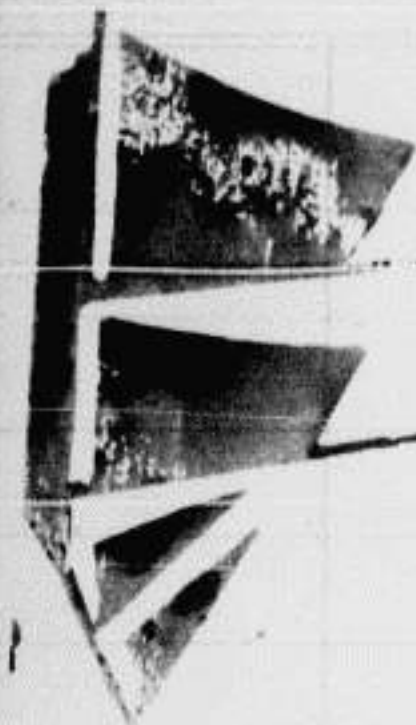

this afternoon saw a Schooner steering to the southward under all sail and gunpowder at sundown took in sail heading west by south had light breezes thence the night &c ends

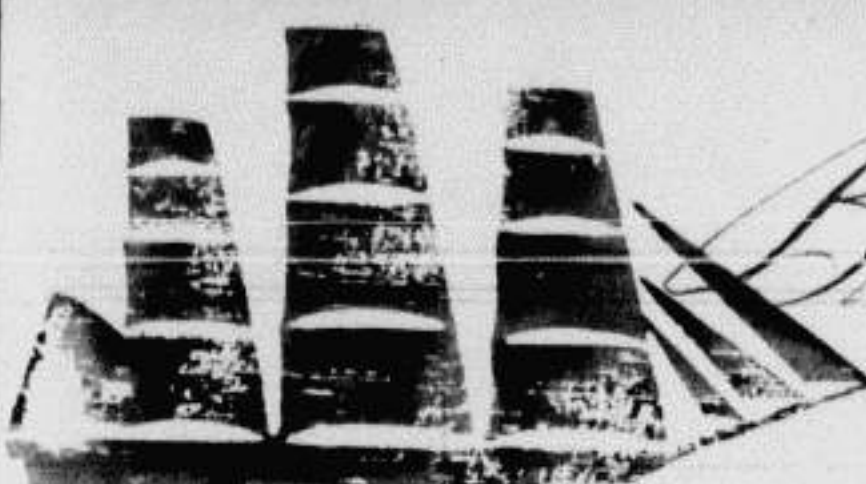
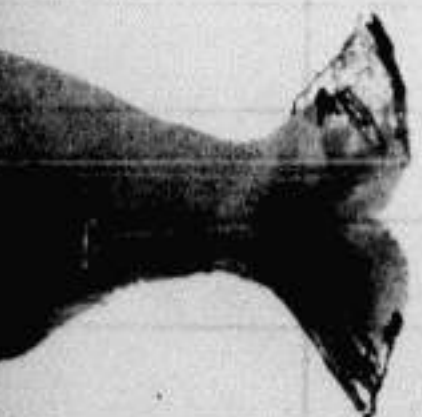
Remarks on board Friday May the 4th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the northward and good weather made sail and stood up to the westward the watch employed setting up the main rigging latitude 27° 45' longitude 75° 15' saw blackfish and hatters at four o'clock got three sets up of the rigging and cleared up decks the Coon seemed to be alive with hatters at sundown took in sail heading west by north better part of the night were round to the eastward had light breezes thence the night &c ends

Remarks on board Saturday May the 5th 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the northward and fine weather Rose Spirit Whales all around the ship made sail and hoisted away all their boats the Starboard boat went right along side of a large Whaler and got fast but drove soon after ahast them until ten o'clock then came on board at eleven o'clock but sight of the whalers set all sail and stood on after them in hopes of coming up with them again latitude 27° 55' longitude 75° 40' at two o'clock saw the Whalers a breaching about eight miles off saw them until four o'clock when we lost sight of them again at sundown took in sail and backed ship headed north west had it calm thence the night &c ends

Remarks on board Sunday May the 6th 1860

Commenced with light breezes from south west and fine weather set all sail and stood east saw Blackfish going quick to the westward latitude 27° 45' longitude 75° 40' saw a Sail steering to the northward under all sail had fine weather thence the day at sundown took in sail and were ship headed north west at twelve o'clock hauled slack the four topmasts and lay aback until daylight &c ends

Remarks on board Monday May the 7th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from north west and good weather made sail and were ship and stood south east the watch employed got out water and working in the rigging at ten o'clock saw the reef tacked ship to the northward and westward latitude 27° 20' longitude 75° 04' had fine weather thence the day at sundown took in sail heading north west by west thence the night &c ends

Remarks on board Tuesday May the 8th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from south west and good weather made sail and backed ship to the southward nothing going on more than ordinary ship duty at ten o'clock saw the reef tacked ship to the northward and westward latitude 27° 25' longitude 75° 20' at four o'clock Rose Spirit Whales off the bow five miles off aft off bow the wind at half past four light two and hoisted away all three boats and held for the
