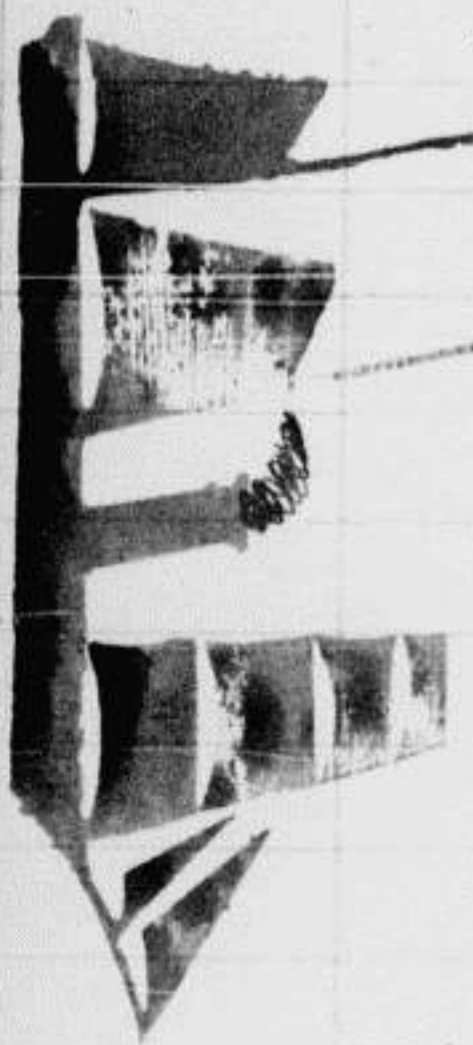


Brig Kate Cory

Remarks on board Friday May the 18th 1860



Commenced with light air from the eastward and fine weather made sail and sent the jib the watch employed keeping out for provisions saw grampies latitude $27^{\circ} 53'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 30'$ saw a Steamer sailing south west had light air then the day at sundown took in sail heading north east by east but by the night the wind shifted round to the southward was ship to the westward So ends

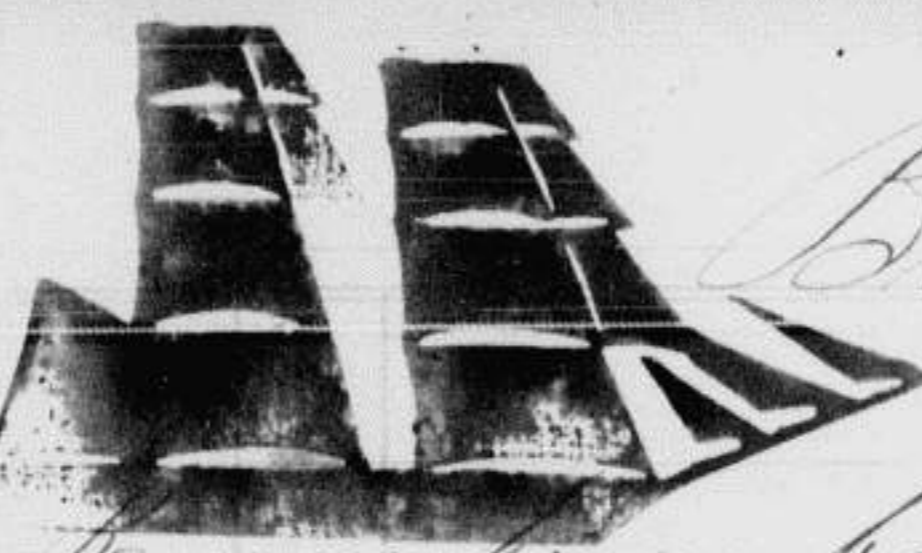
Remarks on board Saturday May the 19th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from the southward and good weather made sail and stood on to the westward at eight o'clock heeled ship to the southward and eastward latitude $27^{\circ} 54'$ longitude $78^{\circ} 30'$ this after noon heeled ship to the northward and westward had fine breeze then the day saw nothing at sundown took in sail heading north east at ten o'clock was ship to the eastward had light breeze then the night So ends

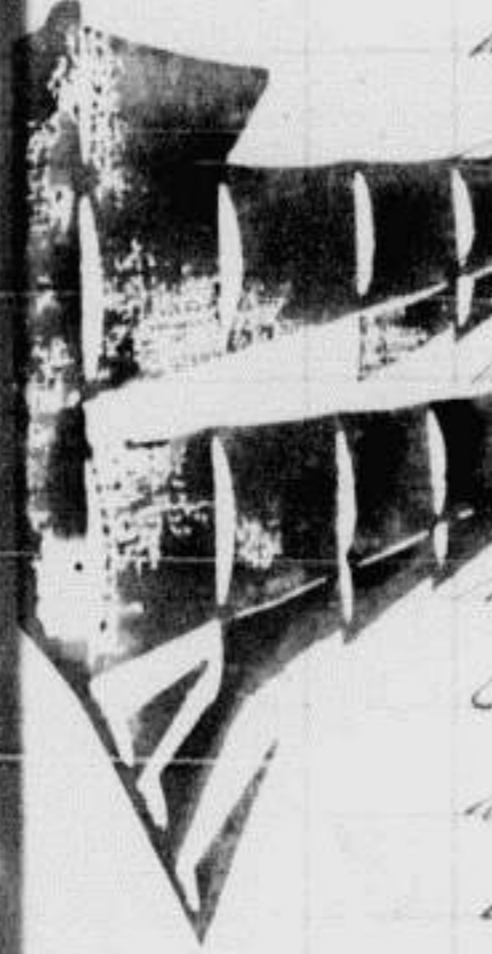
Remarks on board Sunday May the 20th 1860

Commenced with a light breeze from the southward and westward and fine weather set all sail and stood on to the eastward and westward at five o'clock saw a vessel at one o'clock got a light breeze from the eastward stood to the southward saw grampies at sundown took in sail and north west and then the night with a light breeze So ends

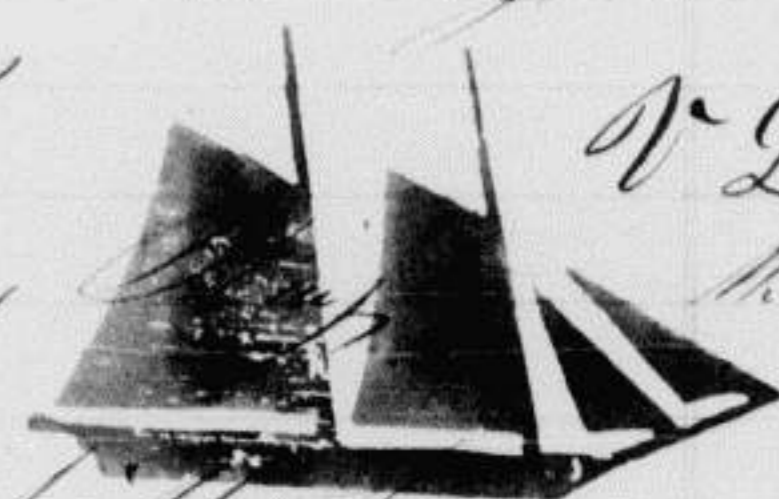


Remarks on board Monday May the 21st 1860



Commenced with light breeze from the southward and fine weather set all sail and stood on to the watch employed steering and pointing the anchor saw a sail to the westward of us sailing to the eastward latitude $28^{\circ} 50'$ longitude $79^{\circ} 25'$ at one o'clock the Schooner Potentia Daine of Propanahau spoke as she is four months out then saw two Merchant Brigs sailing to the eastward under all sail had light breeze then the day at sundown took in sail sailing south north east had light air then the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday May the 22nd 1860



Commenced with light breeze from the southward and fine weather set all sail and stood north east the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty saw one sail to the westward of us sailing to the eastward latitude $29^{\circ} 14'$ longitude $79^{\circ} 40'$ at one o'clock hoisted the mainmast and picked up a board and caught a mess of fish at four o'clock got a light breeze from south west at sundown took in sail at ten o'clock by the wind to the southward had light breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday May the 23rd 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from the westward and good weather made sail and kept off north east saw two
