Am. left off before the wind steered east and we sails standing to the northward nothing going in more than ordinary ships duty latitude 34° 25' N longitude 73° 39' W had strong breezes from the east at sundown the wind shifted round to the northward took in sail and left to the wind headed east south east had fresh breezes from the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday May the 29th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the northward and sailed rather set the jib and mainsail and stood on to the northward and eastward nothing going in more than ordinary ships duty saw a large shoal of fishes at nine o'clock took in the mainsail latitude 34° 50' N longitude 74° 50' W saw three sails the head sail and one to the northward and eastward at four o'clock called the men down from aloft at sundown high in the jib heading north east had a heavy sea running ahead a gale from the night So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday May the 30th 1860

Commenced with a gale of wind from the northward and a heavy sea running by the heading to the eastward latitude 35° 00' N longitude 75° 40' W after noon had a moderate wind the wind headed north east for most part and at 4 o'clock at sundown had a quite moderate wind a light breeze from the night So ends

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Remarks on board Thursday May the 31st 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the northward and fair weather set the jib and stood on to the eastward and down the foremast and commenced repairing it saw a sail to the northward of us latitude 35° 45' N longitude 76° 50' W this afternoon had a calm at six o'clock got the foremast reefed and kept it again took in the jib had light air from the westward heading north by the wind at twelve o'clock left off east north east latitude 36° 00' N longitude 77° 00' W saw twenty four sails had fresh breezes So ends

Remarks on board Friday June the 1st 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the westward and fair weather made sail and stood on higher out for water the watch employed sailing up the foremast arriving latitude 32° 20' N longitude 67° 15' W at one o'clock left the Brig east for Bermuda saw a Brig steering south east at sundown took in sail had strong breezes steering east by north had strong breezes from the night So ends

Remarks on board Saturday June the 2nd 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from the westward and thick ahead within a mile o'clock raised Bermuda ahead east of north east and ran down the north side of the island at one o'clock brought up the gear and left to the wind to the northward at three o'clock a pilot came along side reported the Brig John Dorrer of
