

Brig Kate Cory

After Breakfast going at anchor at Gage
town with two thousand and fifty barrels
of some one kind of oil and going down
Calan saw the land about ten miles off
to the northward and westward of us
latter part of the night had a light
breeze So ends

Remarks on board Sunday June the 3rd 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the
westward and fair weather made sail and
lashed ship to the northward and
leant in for the land at ten o'clock
got in near the land took some alligators
and eight of them the wind staid
south and by east latitude 32.10 N
longitude 84.35 W saw a Bark and
a Schooner sailing off to the light
this after noon had fresh breezes at
sundown took in sail steering south
and by east had light breezes thru
the night So ends

Remarks on board Monday June the 4th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the
southward and good weather made sail and
stood on to the southward and westward
the watch employed working on the rigging
latitude 32.35 N longitude 68.00 W
saw a schooner had fine weather thru the
day at sundown took in sail heading
east south east by the wind at twelve o'clock
lashed ship to the westward had strong
breezes and equally better thru the
night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 5th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from
south west and thick and foggy weather
set the jib and was still to
the southward and eastward saw a sail steering
north east nothing going on north something
latitude 31.10 N longitude 62.00 W had
strong breezes all this day at sundown
took in the jib and were still to the
westward had strong breezes thru the
night So ends these twenty four
hours

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 6th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from
south west and thick and foggy weather
were round and stood east by north saw
a Schooner steering south east and no
latitude and by north the water perhaps
drinking out by water and getting there
had strong breezes thru the day and
night stood east by north So ends

Remarks on board Thursday June the 7th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from
south west and thick and foggy weather
at eight o'clock turned the ship out
of the tropic and set the jib had
at more midnight latitude 32.22 N
longitude 55.22 W kept up east
saw a Brig steering west north west
nothing going on north something at
sundown took in sail had strong breezes
thru the night and rain better
staid east all these twenty four
hours So ends
