Remarks on board Friday June the 8th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south west and raged and rising rather at sight lighted up some of the jib and turned the ship out of the harbor the patch employed making out for breeze latitude $33^{\circ} 53'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 32'$ We saw a ship steering west north west had strong breezes then the day clearing and of sundown took in sail and kept to the wind headed south east saw a sail to the board of us heading to the southward and eastward had strong breezes then the night So ends

Remarks on board Saturday June the 9th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and thick and raged rather saw a ship steering to the southward and eastward latitude $33^{\circ} 04'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 42'$ nothing going on more than ordinary ship's duty had strong breezes all this day heading south east by the wind had strong breezes then the night So ends

Remarks on board Sunday June the 10th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and thick and raged rather heading south east by the wind latitude $32^{\circ} 46'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 00'$ nothing going on more than ordinary ship's duty had strong breezes all this day a sundown had a little more moderate nothing in sight had strong breezes then the night So ends there twenty four hours

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Remarks on board Monday June the 11th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and thick and raged rather tacked ship to the westward and set the jib the patch employed making out for water and provisions latitude $32^{\circ} 32'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 16'$ saw a ship and caught one of sundown took in the jib had a moderate heading west by the wind at twelve o'clock were ship to the southward and eastward latitude part of the night there a strong again So ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 12th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and raged rather nothing going on more than ordinary ship's duty saw large shoal of porpoises heading south east by the wind latitude $32^{\circ} 24'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 12'$ saw a Brig steering to the westward had strong breezes all this day a sundown had a round headed west by the wind latitude part of the night had it raining and squally heading to the westward So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 13th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and raged rather at eight o'clock lighted up more the small heads saw a sail off the lee bow steering to the westward latitude $32^{\circ} 15'$ longitude $55^{\circ} 10'$ broke out for floor and wet hole at three o'clock commenced raining again had it raining then the night So ends
