Remarks on board Thursday June the 14th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and fair weather at the jib and mainsail and stood on to the westward nothing going on more than ordinary ship's duty saw two sail one steering to the westward and the other to the northward and eastward at ten o'clock looked ship heads south and east by south latitude 32° 30' longitude 51° 17' middle of the day had it raining at two o'clock lighted up some nothing in night at sandown took in sail heading south and by south had it raining thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Friday June the 15th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and rainy weather at nine o'clock stood off at the jib and stood on to the northward and eastward nothing going on with remarking latitude 32° 07' longitude 49° 58' had fresh breezes thru the day saw nothing at sandown took in the jib and looked ship heads north west by west by the wind had fresh breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Saturday June the 16th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from west north west and rainy weather was ship to the northward the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 31° 42' longitude 49° 20' had strong breezes thru the day at sandown saw ship heads north west latter part of the night had it raining So ends this day

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Remarks on board Sunday June the 17th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from the westward and rainy and rapid weather was ship to the northward and westward at seven o'clock stood off at the jib latitude 31° 22' longitude 49° 30' had strong breezes thru the day saw nothing at sandown took in the jib heading south west by west at three o'clock was ship to the northward had fresh breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Monday June the 18th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the westward and fair weather at the jib and looked ship to the northward saw a sail steering to the eastward the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 30° 20' longitude 49° 47' had fresh breezes thru the day saw nothing of the fish kind at sandown looked ship and took in the jib heading north by west had strong breezes thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 19th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from west north west and rapid weather at the jib and mainsail and stood on to the northward and westward the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude 30° 30' longitude 50° 00' at one o'clock took look in the mainsail and set the topsail Made an anchor row blackish going quick to windward at sandown took in the jib heading north west latter part of the night
