

## Brig Kate Cory

Had it squally and rainy So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 20th 1860

Commenced with light breeze from west north west and squally and rainy weather at seven o'clock stand off set the jib and mainsail and steady on to the northward latitude  $31^{\circ} 16'$  longitude  $51^{\circ} 12'$  the watch employed making out for water and weighing here had light breeze then the day at sundown took in sail heading north had it calm for few hours of the night latter part got a breeze from south west heading north west So ends

Remarks on board Thursday June the 21st 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from south west and good weather at all sail and stood on to the northward and westward the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude  $31^{\circ} 44'$  longitude  $51^{\circ} 30'$  saw a schooner had fine weather then the day at sundown took in sail heading north west by the wind had fresh breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Friday June the 22nd 1860

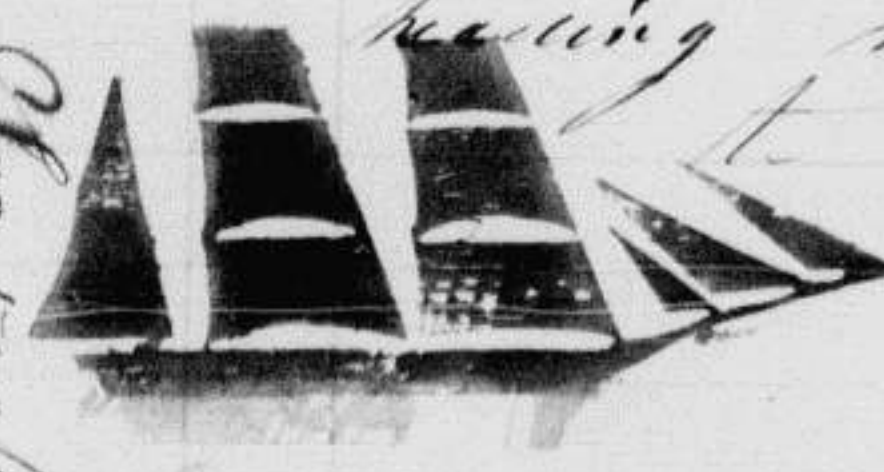
Commenced with fresh breeze from south west and fair weather at the jib and mainsail and took in ship to the northward and westward gave two sails steering north and the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty latitude  $31^{\circ} 50'$  longitude  $52^{\circ} 00'$  at half past twelve took in ship by the northward saw two sails to



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The windward at four o'clock the bark San of Mattapanett Blanaas Water with five hundred barrels of oil like us game with her until eight o'clock took in sail heading north west at ten o'clock were still to the southward had fine weather then the night So ends

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Remarks on board Saturday June the 23rd 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from south west and good weather made sail and left off before the wind stand east north east the watch employed making out for provisions and weighing here latitude  $32^{\circ} 10'$  longitude  $51^{\circ} 30'$  saw a Merchant ship steering north east had fine weather then the day at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed south had light breeze then the night So ends

Remarks on board Sunday June the 24th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from south west and good weather made sail and left off before the wind stand east saw a schooner and grampus caught near doffkin saw a Sail steering north east latitude  $32^{\circ} 05'$  longitude  $49^{\circ} 19'$  at four o'clock saw aheads off the harbor how eight miles off had the wind light did not make out what they was at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed south had light breeze then the night and fine weather So ends three twenty four hours
