Remarks on board Monday June the 25th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the westward and good weather made sail and set off north east the watch employed looking out for water saw a Sloop standing south east latitude $34^{\circ} 55'$ longitude $75^{\circ} 30'$ We had fine weather then the day cleared south east at sundown took in sail and left to the wind hauled water west had fine breezes from the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 26th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the westward and fair weather turning the reef out of the topsail and set off north east nothing going on with remaining latitude $34^{\circ} 00'$ longitude $45^{\circ} 00'$ at four o'clock spoke the Brig Seemore of Westport Decatur Master 224 bbls gunnec with her masted sandown took in sail heading south west by the wind had fresh breezes the fore part of the night latter part the wind hauled round to the northward had light breezes So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 27th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the northward and fine weather made sail and stood on to the westward nothing going on with remaining saw black pilot going quick did not leave for them latitude $30^{\circ} 00'$ longitude $44^{\circ} 46'$ at twilight spoke another ship to the eastward saw the Brig Seemore to the westward of us

Standing to the westward had fine weather then the day at sundown took in ship and took in sail heading west by north latter part of the night were round to the northward and eastward had fine weather So ends

Remarks on board Thursday June the 28th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from west north west and good weather set all sail and took ship to the southward and put on a humpback the watch employed in sailing ship at day nine o'clock spoke ship to the northward saw a sail to the westward latitude $35^{\circ} 00'$ longitude $45^{\circ} 00'$ We had fine weather then the day at sundown took in sail heading north by the wind latter part of the night had a squally and rainy So ends

Remarks on board Friday June the 29th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from the westward and rainy weather at seven o'clock cleared off made sail and stood on to the northward and westward latitude $34^{\circ} 16'$ longitude $45^{\circ} 25'$ We the watch employed looking out for water and provisions and water hole had fine breezes this afternoon and good weather at sundown took in sail heading north north west by the wind saw a Sail off the weather hauled latter part of the night were round to the westward had the wind from north west So ends these twenty four hours
