 This afternoon looked out for water and
 met her at four o'clock with the
 four light had it equally at
 sundown took in sail heading south
 with sail by the wind had strong
 breeze from the night and aged with
 the crew.

Remarks in board Friday July the 6th 1860

Commenced with moderate gale from
 the westward and aged with nothing
 going in more than canvas ship's cargo
 latitude 32.27 N longitude 30.50 W
 saw a Brig steering to the eastward
 at four o'clock began to moderate
 and the breeze to the southward when
 the ship had it moderate from the
 night the crew.

Remarks in board Saturday July the 7th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from
 the westward and fine weather made
 sail and stood on to the southward and
 westward. The watch employed in covering
 the boats and deck and making in
 the evening at eleven o'clock hoisted
 a boat and went along side of the
 Brig Geranium of Boston from
 Penobscot bound to Rio de Janeiro with
 lumber by Mace St. 0.15 N longitude 50.00 W
 had fine breeze from the ship at
 sundown took in sail heading west
 with sail by the wind had light
 breeze from the night the crew
 then hoisted four hours

 Remarks in board Sunday July the 8th 1860

Commenced with fine breeze from
 the westward and fine weather made
 sail and stood on to the westward
 saw geranium latitude 30.25 N
 longitude 50.50 W this afternoon
 had the wind more from the
 eastward heading north west at
 four o'clock hoisted a Shole of
 Small Shrimps which going like
 lightning land all three boats and
 shot them but could not get
 fast as hard back came to follow
 us still at sundown came on board
 and took in sail heading north
 west by north by the wind had fresh
 breeze from the night made to the
 southward the latter part the crew.

Remarks in board Monday July the 9th 1860

Commenced with fresh breeze from
 the eastward and aged with moderate
 sail and stood on to the southward
 hoisted a Shole of Shrimps
 few points off the weather bore four
 miles off. Hoisted ship's cargo
 at nine o'clock got up with about
 two miles of them and hoisted away
 all three boats and held for them
 at ten o'clock the standard boat
 came up with the abails and struck
 me in a box which came up and
 her and stole the boat had the loaded
 boat pulled up and took the line
 but feared that they are lost so
 hoisted up the boats once and took
 the boat in tow and started for the
