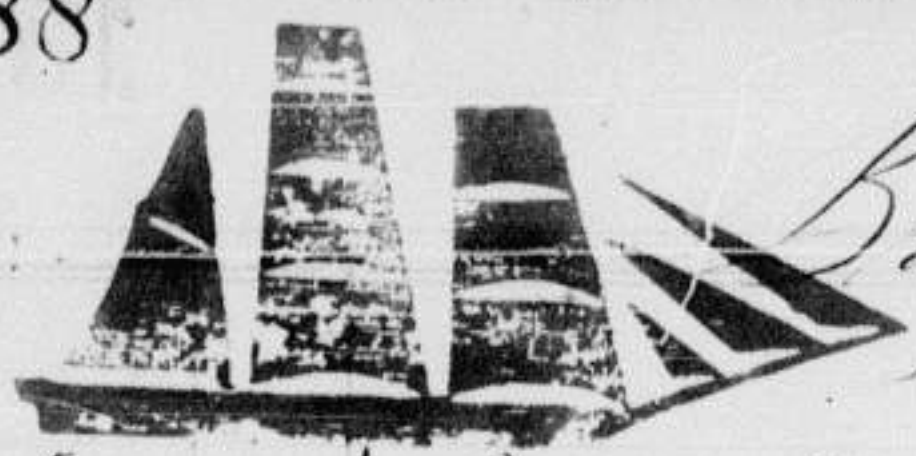


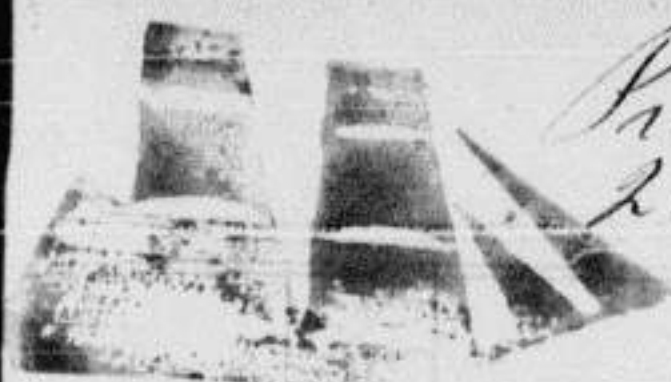


Brig Hattie Gray

Dearest) Brig the wait boat about the wharfe
about an hour and lost sight of them
going eyes out to windward so give it
up and come in house rather down at
the mouth get the standard boat
hoisted up and then commenced heading
to windward again in hopes of coming
about with the wharfe again saw them
breaching about two o'clock saw a merchant
brig on the westward of us standing
to the northward had strong breeze
threw the crew at sundown took in
sail and passed ship to the southward
about 2 or 2 1/2 miles back at 4 1/2 miles
had strong breeze then the night so
ended

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 10th 1860

Commenced with strong breeze from the
eastward and raged wither took the Standard
boat in on deck and commenced heading
it was still to the northward about 8 or 10
miles at 5 1/2 miles back fifteen minutes past
three o'clock Raised Shrim Wharfe about
a mile off to the windward got the
boat ready and board away the barbed
and wait boat the barbed boat got
most on to on forty barrel wharfe when
he saw something out went down when
he came up again they was going to windward
eyes out about three miles from
about got with in about a mile and
a half several times but could get no more
at five o'clock came in house with the
same strong breeze and feeling more down
hearted than ever at sundown took in the
jib heading south east by the wind
had strong breeze and raged wither then the
night so ended

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 11th 1860

Commenced with strong breeze from
the eastward and raged and raged wither
Raised a Shrike of Shrim Wharfe
all around the ship galed going all
ways round the two barbed boats and
tryed to get past but met with the
same hard luck at nine o'clock came
on board saw the Brig Periton take a
whale along side our ship and stand
along by the wind to the northward
and papales breaching all around broke up
for water and passing ballance 3 miles
longer 5 or 5 1/2 miles at one o'clock left
off before the wind and raged to
a Shrike of wharfe at five o'clock board
the two barbed boats and held for
them but before the boats got the
wharfe a lot of papales went in among
them and galed the wharfe got about
to them several times but could not
get on about them until sundown
then came on board and took up
the boats heading south south east
by the wind but it a little
more moderate than light breeze then
the night so ended

Remarks on board Thursday July the 12th 1860

Commenced with light breeze from
the eastward and gentle wither under sail
Raised Shrim wharfe to the beyond
three miles off got the standard boat
on the cranes and the boats ready and
left off before the wind after the
wharfe at seven o'clock left to the
wind and board away all three boats
