And hauled for the whales after observing about one hour and a half all three boats succeeded in getting fast but a last whale joined the stranded boats here and hauled it and lost the whale turned up the other two and took them along side about one o'clock got dinner and got away and commenced sailing at three o'clock seeing a whale going south to the harbor got there eating about five o'clock and saw some the sailing gear and hauled away two boats and hauled for the whale but saw nothing from the boats at sundown came on board and took in sail heading north east saw the Brig Shedden to the westward in pursuit of whales later part of the evening from here had it raining. So ends

Remarks on board Friday July the 13th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and squally weather with the gale and stood on to the westward and westward at mid day had fine weather latitude $30^{\circ} 41' N$ longitude $56^{\circ} 12' W$. This afternoon had light squally of rain at six o'clock Captain Adams came on board from the Brig Shedden and stated a short time would start for home in a few days reported taking two whales making forty barrels had three hundred spinn and ready of shape at sundown took in the gale had it raining the first part of the night latter part strong breeze. So ends

Remarks on board Saturday July the 14th 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the eastward and fine weather made sail

And took ship to the westward at seven o'clock got three heaving and cold down stood up and washed off decks latitude $30^{\circ} 15' N$ longitude $56^{\circ} 25' W$. This afternoon hauled for provisions had light breeze from the ship at sundown saw Shedden ahead took in sail heading to the eastward on July in sight had it rain the first part of the night latter part had it raining and squally. So ends

Remarks on board Sunday July the 15th 1860

Commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and squally weather with the gale and stood on to the westward and westward at mid day had fine weather latitude $30^{\circ} 41' N$ longitude $56^{\circ} 12' W$. This afternoon had light squally of rain at six o'clock Captain Adams came on board from the Brig Shedden and stated a short time would start for home in a few days reported taking two whales making forty barrels had three hundred spinn and ready of shape at sundown took in the gale had it raining the first part of the night latter part strong breeze. So ends

Remarks on board Monday July the 16th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from the eastward and squally weather with the gale and stood on to the westward and westward at mid day had fine weather latitude $30^{\circ} 26' N$ longitude $56^{\circ} 00' W$
