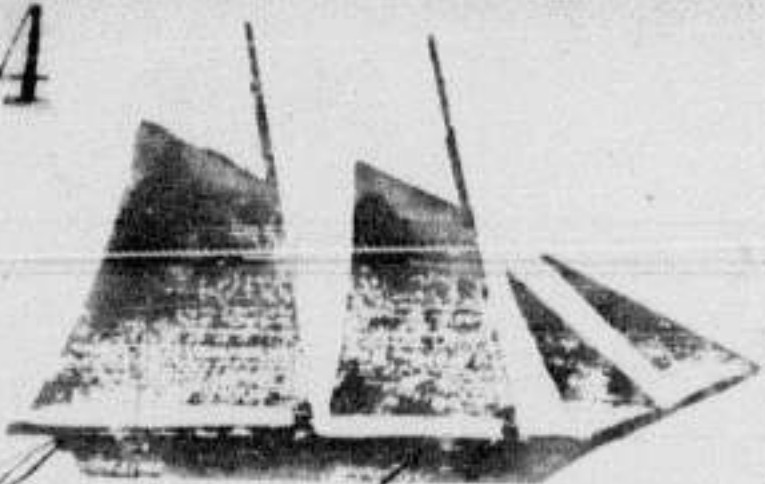




Brig Skate Coy

Remarks on board Saturday July the 21st 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the southward and fine weather made sail and stood to the eastward the watch employed working in the evening saw a Schooner standing to the westward latitude $34^{\circ} 10'$ longitude $54^{\circ} 08'$ We this afternoon had a nearly calm headwind to the eastward then the day at sundown took in sail and it calmed down the night So ends

Remarks on board Sunday July the 22nd 1860

Commenced with light breezes from south west and fine weather set all sail and hauled ship to the westward saw two Sails to the westward latitude $34^{\circ} 25'$ longitude $54^{\circ} 05'$ We had light breezes at first, viz. at 10° minutes raised a Spiny Whale off the water for three miles off line and all three boats and pulled for them at five minutes after sundown the Starboard boat struck a whale the other boats could not get past it being dark landed up the whale and took him in six and half for the brig at half past nine o'clock got him along side and took in sail and it calmed down the night So ends

Remarks on board Monday July the 23rd 1860

Commenced with fine weather but calm got the sailing gear up and commenced sailing in the whale at seven o'clock. Got three whales and

Sept. across the sailing gear got braked and commenced sailing along the head yard and sailing up the water at the jib and four throat hauled light air from the westward latitude $34^{\circ} 35'$ longitude $54^{\circ} 09'$ We this afternoon the watch employed clearing and hauling the iron work at sundown took in sail and no wind heading at eight o'clock part of the night got a light breeze from the eastward heading to the westward by the wind So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 24th 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the eastward and fine weather made sail and stood on to the southward got ready and commenced hauling at 10 the whale latitude $34^{\circ} 20'$ longitude $54^{\circ} 02'$ saw a Schooner standing to the westward with all sail set this afternoon fine breezes broke out for water and meat at sundown took in sail heading south south east by the wind at eight o'clock got three whales and cooked down one ship to the southward and eastward till part of the night headed up fresh So ends

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 25th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the eastward and fair weather set the jib and stood on to the northward the watch employed working in the evening and sailing up about the vessel latitude $32^{\circ} 20'$ longitude $54^{\circ} 02'$
