Remarks on board Monday July the 30th 1860

Commenced with five barrels fired
north with east wind good weather
and sail and steered north the
watch employed with rigging down and
sleeping and painting the iron work
between 3⁰⁰ & 5⁰⁰ M long haul 5⁰⁰ & 6⁰⁰ M
had five with three the day a
sudden look in sail shipwreck west
and a Bark to the westward of us
at eight o'clock spoke the Greek of
Barbours by mistake got with another
five barrels toward about and went alongside
he got some papers and asked them the
night meaning to the northward and
southward So ended

Remarks on hand Sunday July the 31st 1860

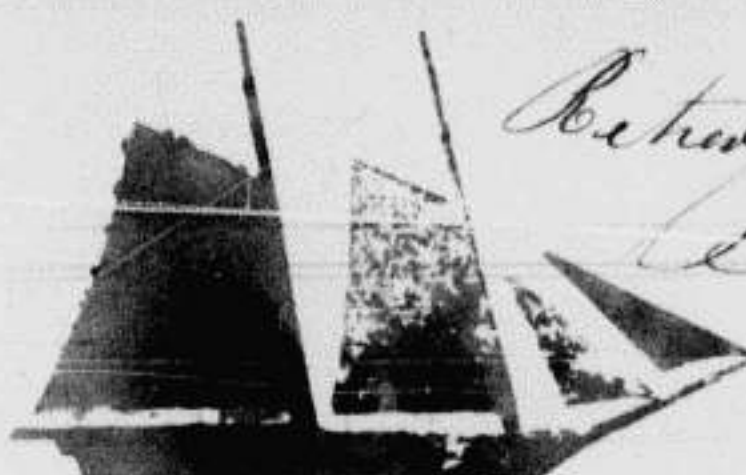
Commenced with fine breeze from north
east and fine weather made sail and
sift off water out to north the
water employed being down and
nothing done within 32nd 16th length
5th 22nd 4th this afternoon left the
wind to the southward and westward
broke out for water had fine weather
threw the day at sundown took in
sail heading north by west by the
wind at twelve o'clock tacked ship
to the northward and sailed here
light breeze threw the night so
on as

Remarks on home Wednesday August 1st 1860

Commonest with fine leaves from
neath east and good with more
east and were shik to the southeast

The water continued clearing and bringing
the ice with me working in the
morning saw a Schona of the ~~harbour~~ coast of
as latitude 32. or 33. longitude 52. 48. 49
at twelve o'clock raised anchor ahead
five miles off thought they were whales
going by eyes and the windward saw them
third rising did not bear saw the
schona the sea was with heat down
thought they were trying a whale
at four o'clock looked ship to the
northward and eastward had been
active then the way at sundown look
in sail bearing north east by the
wind at twelve o'clock were ship to
the southward had light houses then the
night 15. ice.

Remarks on board Thursday August the 2nd 1865

Commenced with light breeze from
the eastward and good weather more
sail and left off south west the
watch employed cleaning and painting
the iron work bottom etc 4 4 1/2 lengthen
5 to 4 1/2 The this afternoon steved
sailed out by sunset some grasshoppers
had light breeze then the day
at sundown took in and left so
the wind be the southward had it
eaten the better part off the night
